

## Google Sites Information (FAQs):

1. The site quota is held at the domain level -

### Google Apps for Education:

- Site quota: N/A (quota is tracked at the domain level)
- Quota per domain: 100Gb
- Max attachment size: 20Mb
- Sites per domain: unlimited
- Pages per site: unlimited

Keep in mind that Google is wanting you to use their other services and integrate them with Sites. For example, instead of uploading 20 MS Word files, convert them to Google Docs. In this way, you use absolutely 0% of your site's capacity. The same can be said for spreadsheets, presentations, videos, photos, etc.

2. If I create a site without using the ACC template, there is no way to go back and get it into that site in any way?

No, you are able to add a theme to a page after the page has been created.

Login to your site.

Click on More Options

Click on Manage Site

Click on Themes (lower left-hand corner; last link on the left)

Click on Browse more themes (link located in the upper right-hand corner of the screen)

Click on the ACC Google Template

Click Select

Click Save Changes

3. Am I correct that if I create a site, and can't change it the way I like, So I delete it, I can't use that name any more

You're now able to recover a deleted Google Site by going to its old URL within 30 days of deletion.

Note you won't be able to recover any site you tried to delete before the 12th April.
