

ADMISSIONS AND REGISTRATION COMMITTEE

Linda Kluck called the meeting to order. Everyone introduced themselves to the group.

All persons representing their admissions office stated that so far everything is working fine.

Mention was made about the Green Program. At the current time, there is a glitch in the computer system and the \$1.00 per credit hour is not being deducted from students who are registering. As soon as they straighten it out, the "sustainability fee" will be added to the price of registering for a class.

The Registration and payment dates have been approved for the year 2010 through August. Dates for FY 2011 will be considered in the next few months.

A lot of discussion was had regarding the adds/drops period. There is a survey out that says students who miss the first several days of class are less likely to succeed. The legislature is discussing how much money will be given to the different institutions based on their passing rate. Several dates have been discussed and will be voted on at a later date.

At the September 8th meeting the Admissions and Registration Committee (ARC) members discussed a proposed change to the ACC student-initiated course withdrawal policy. Specifically, they discussed the possibility of allowing students to withdraw using the College's automated Online Services system.

The ARC is supportive of the proposal and has been asked by Dr. Christensen to refer the balance of the discussion and formal recommendation to the SASC, to formulate the final recommendation to the Student Services Council and ultimately the Academic and Campus Affairs Council for discussions and approval.

There is a change in the next meeting date to Tuesday, November 17.
