COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Description: Introduction to the Internet including E-mail, World Wide Web (WWW), and how to perform basic research to address company/business needs. Topics include accessing and navigating the Internet, covering concepts, terms, tools, and services such as Internet Service provider (ISP's), newsgroups, and chat rooms. Learn how to browse and search the Internet successfully using popular browsers and search tools. Prerequisites: Fundamentals of PC Use, including Orientation to Windows, or equivalent experience.

Objectives: Every student will be able to:

- Discuss what the Internet is
- Discuss the history of the Internet
- Identify resources available on the Internet
- Define e-mail, newsgroups, chats, and web
- Discuss Netiquette
- Describe different ways to access the Internet
- Browse the Web
- Perform searches using Internet search tools
- Save and download from the Internet
- Discuss how to protect the computer from viruses

Rationale: The Internet is increasingly used in all the businesses and organizations. This course will enable students to understand and use the Internet efficiently at home and work.
