Did you know?

- Over a lifetime, an associate degree is worth \$510,000 more than a high school diploma
- 56% of Hispanics in higher education are enrolled in community colleges.
- Approximately 1,555,000 Hispanics people in the U.S. earned an associate degree in 2006
- From 1994 to 2004, Hispanics have increased their associate degree attainment by 125% and bachelor degree attainment by 88%
- Between July 2005 and June 2006 Hispanics accounted for 19% of ACC's total graduates.
- Hispanic Outlook in Higher Education magazine ranks ACC at #11 on its "Top 50 Community and Junior Colleges by Hispanic Enrollment."

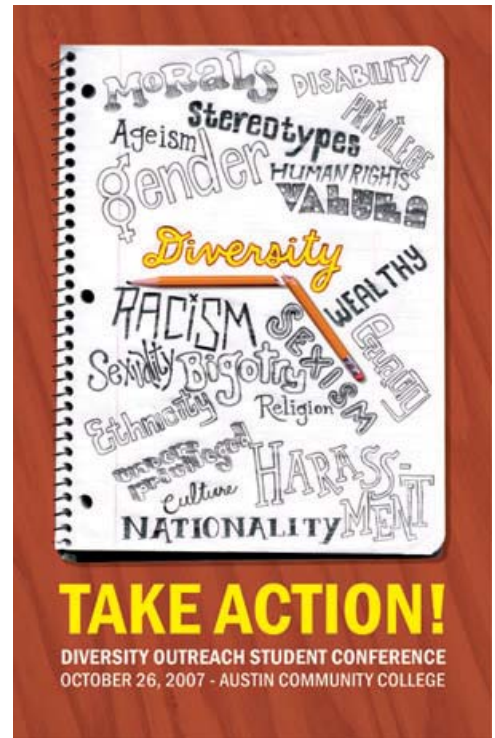
