Admission to the College

- Gain admission to Austin Community College; follow instructions/process at <http://www.austincc.edu> Visit a campus advisor or counselor to determine need for ACC assessment testing.

NOTE: Admission to Austin Community College **does not** guarantee admission to **the Emergency Medical Services Program.**

Admission to the Program

- Review the EMSP website and complete a mandatory EMT-Basic Information Session (on-line): <http://www.austincc.edu/emsp>
- Retain Completion Form to submit with the EMT-Basic application.
 - Print the application (link found only at the bottom of the Completion page).
- Complete all program required immunizations and TB skin test results or chest x-ray. See <http://www.austincc.edu/health> for information and form. The application will not be accepted without a copy of the completed immunization record.
- Submit an EMT-B application with:
- Copy of high school graduation or GED document
 - Immunization documentation with TB skin test results or chest x-ray
 - Copy of American Heart Association CPR card for Health Care Providers (front and back)
 - Information Session Completion Form

CPR certification and TB skin test must be valid though the entire semester attending. The TB is only valid for one year from date administered.

Selection to the Program:

- New classes start in fall, spring, and 11week summer semesters. All applicants must be 18 years of age by the first day of class – no exceptions. Students who have submitted all required paperwork are selected by application date that the application is received in the Health Science Office.
- Please note that to be compliant with clinical requirements a **mandatory criminal background check** will be required prior to admission to the program. As specific timelines must be met, **do not do this until instructed by the program.**

Credit and CE classes are combined, so you will receive the **same training** and upon successful completion, you will be eligible to sit for the **same certification** exam.
