-Introduction to Political Science: [GOVT 2304] This course focuses on the history, scope and methods of political science and the substantive topics in the discipline. It includes a survey of the political culture, institutions, political parties, and public policies of the U.S., Britain, Russia, China, and India, with a special emphasis on Mexico.

-Prerequisite: GOVT 2305 and 2306 Introduction to Archaeology; 2.0 minimum GPA; actively seeking a degree

-A portion of this program will take place in Austin, June 1-12 at Rio Grande Campus, MTWThF.

-The other portion will take place in Mexico June 13-June 27.

-Program application deadline is February 16. Applicants will be interviewed. There are 10 spots available.

Classes are taught by ACC faculty with assistance from the faculty of Marista University. The government program includes: (1) a political science course, (2) a forum course in cultural geography, and (3) an informal language/culture course taught by faculty of the Marista University. Professor Evans is a Fulbright Scholar with primary research experience in comparative politics, including fieldwork in the Middle East, China and Latin America.
