Dwayne Cox presented a report as submitted by George Payne. 1,300 web sites found on the main ACC web server. Committee recommends that Helpdesk contact web page owners and find out if 1) owners still exist 2) if pages are still active. Once owners and pages are confirmed; owners will be provided with web guidelines.

Dwayne Cox and Patty Scogin met with Dr. Kinslow regarding the FY06 marketing & communications plan and need for web enhancement. ACC web site is the most important communications tool at the college. There is a definite need to improve navigability. New home page redesign necessary.

Web publication guidelines are not ready yet. Committee will continue to fine tune points and procedures. A proposal to test launch home page in November and publicize outside of the college in December has been made. (see ACC web site enhancement file attached)

Web committee reviewed draft memo to be sent out by Dr. Kinslow. Recommendations were made to change wording and bullet order. Memo sent out ALL_ACC on June 9, 2005 (see memo attached)

Preview of proposed division & department site templates presented. Edward Terry explained the standards of the template such as; logo, menu on top right, image pattern across middle (can be custom modified), search button (Google), benefits bar (right of Google search) and ACC links. A "breadcrumb" link was provided for user (shows who/where page originator). Buttons were provided on page that would allow user to change text size. A printer friendly option for users that pulls from content only requested (no menu bars or unnecessary links or graphics). Site link area available on the mid section left side of the page. Standard defaults or custom links can be used. Contact information for page (who/where) will be provided on sites.
