Continuing Education Effectiveness Measures Report for Academic Year 2002-03



PURPOSE

The purpose of Continuing Education is to provide courses and training to all individuals who wish to improve their job, career, or personal skills.

INTENDED OUTCOME

1. Students who take continuing education courses will be satisfied with those courses.

CRITERION

1a. Based on data provided by the continuing education "Program Evaluation" forms, the mean "overall course" rating will be no lower than 4 on a scale of 1= lowest to 5= highest for 80% of all continuing education courses evaluated.

RESULTS

This criterion was met. Based on data provided by the Continuing Education office, over 98% of all continuing education courses offered in academic year 2002-03 achieved a mean overall course rating of at least 4 on a scale of 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest).

CRITERION

1b. Based on data provided by the continuing education "Program Evaluation" forms, the mean rating of the item, "The content assisted me in achieving my personal objectives." will be no lower than 4 on a scale of 1= lowest to 5= highest for 80% of all continuing education courses evaluated.

RESULTS

This criterion was met. Based on data provided by the Continuing Education office, over 97% of all continuing education courses offered in academic year 2002-03 achieved a mean course rating of at least 4 on a scale of 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest) for the item, "The content assisted me in achieving my personal objectives."
