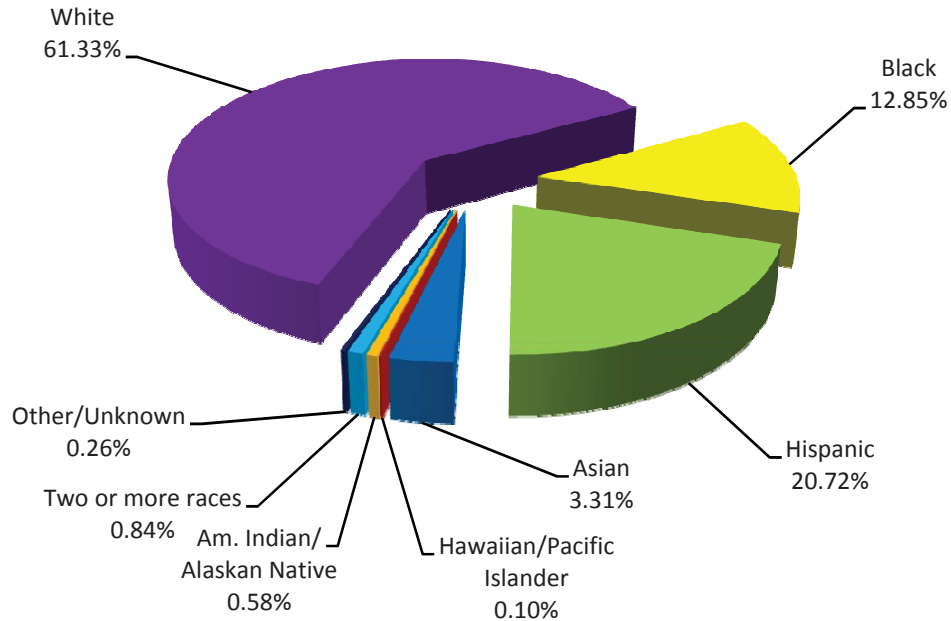

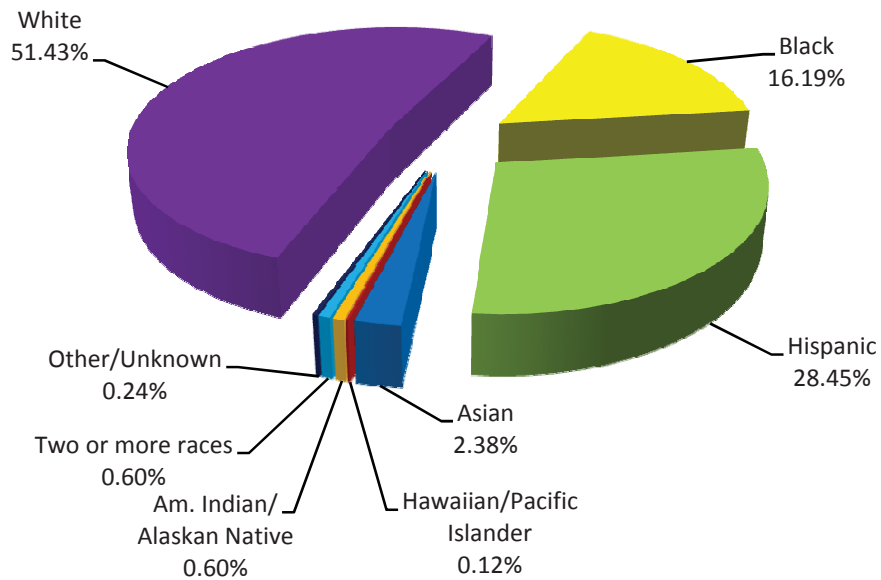

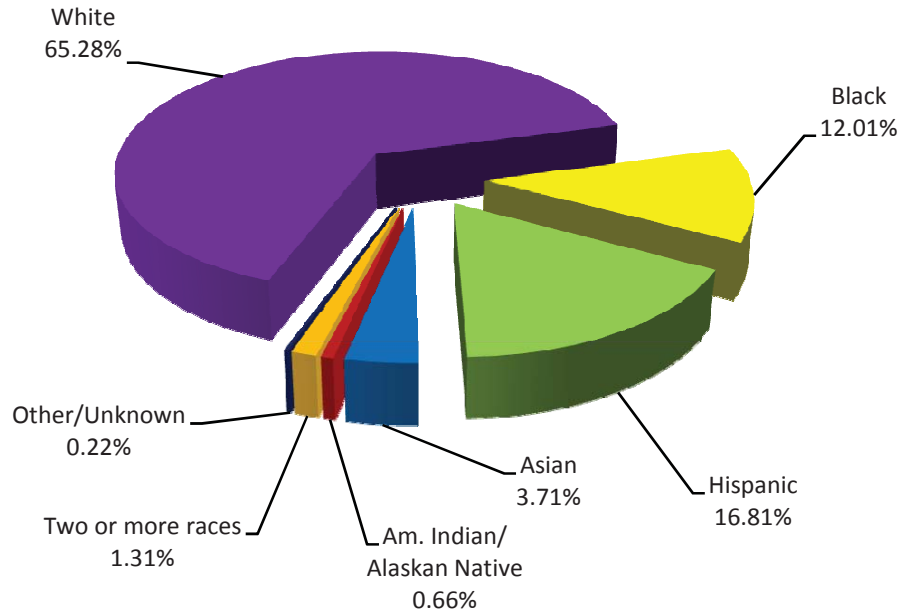

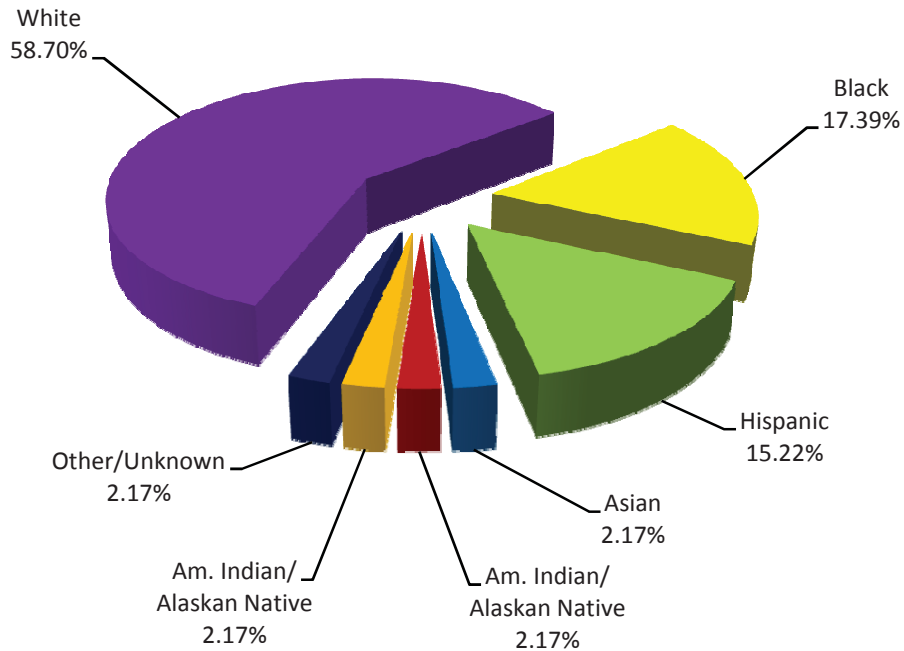

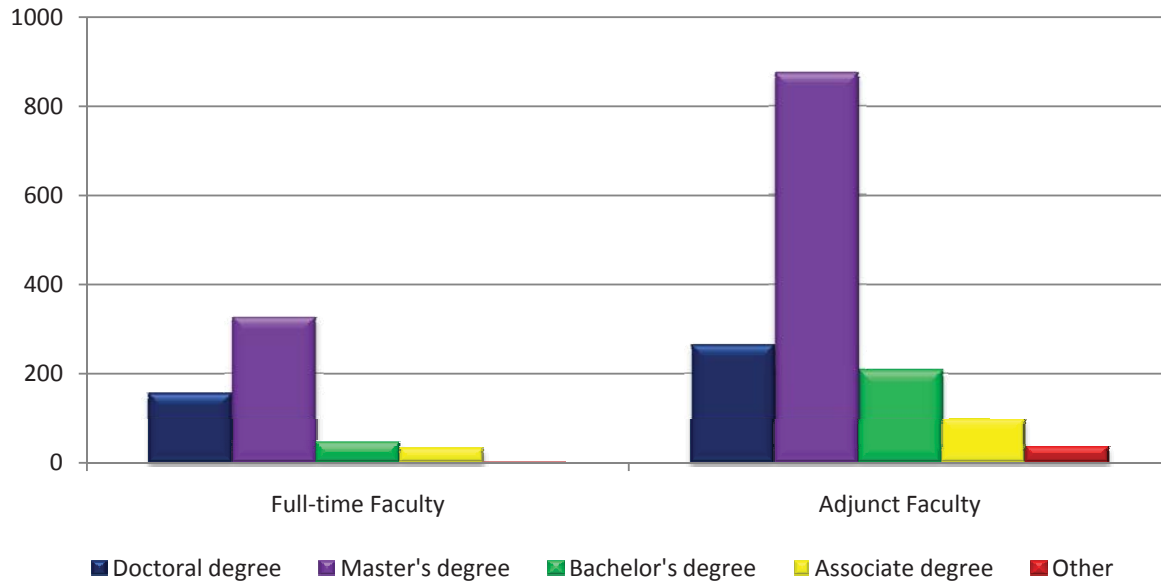

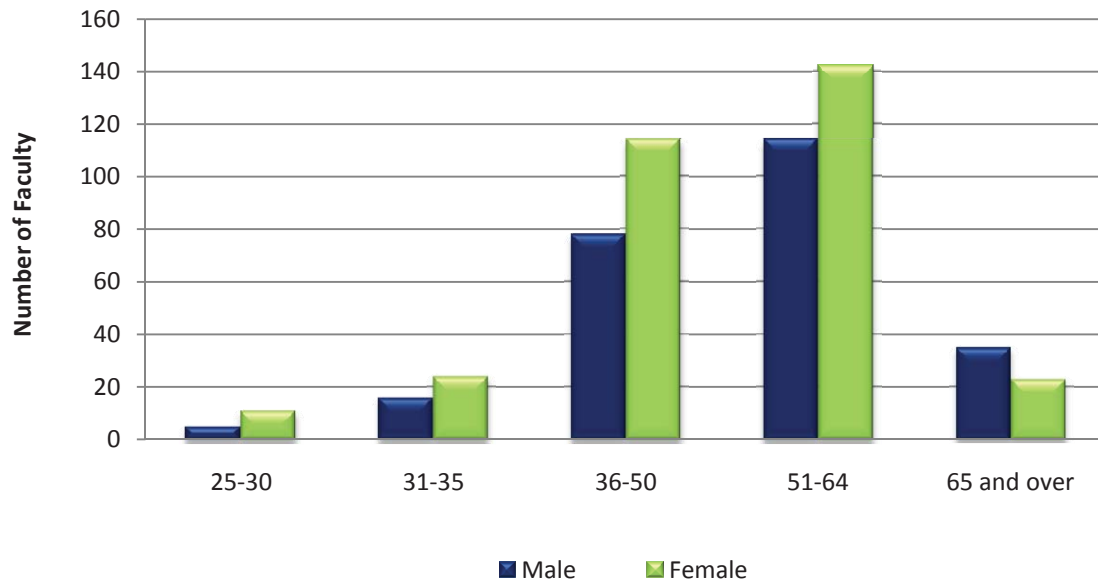

Full-time Faculty¹ by Age and Gender Spring 2010



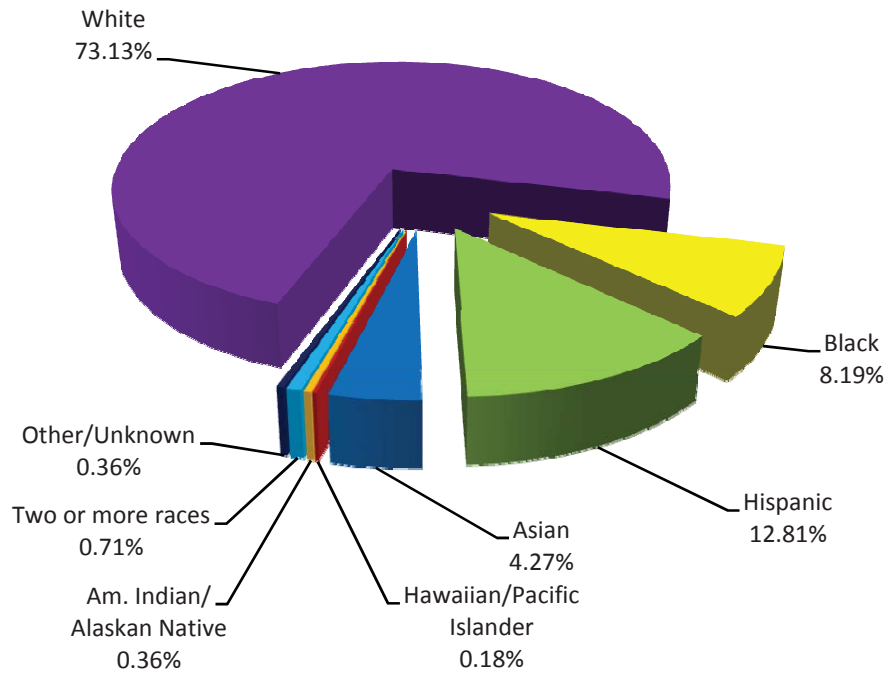

Full-time Faculty¹ by Race/Ethnicity and Gender Spring 2010



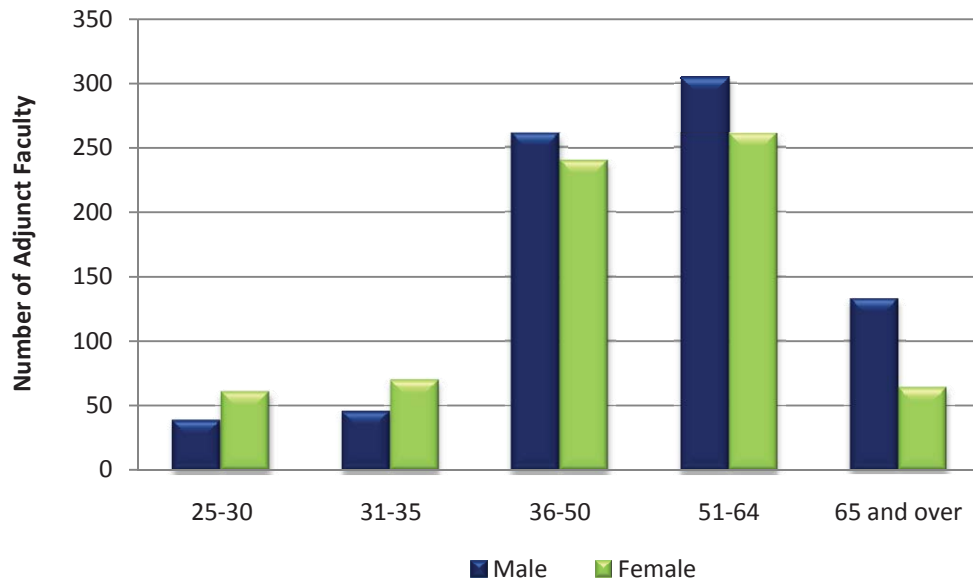

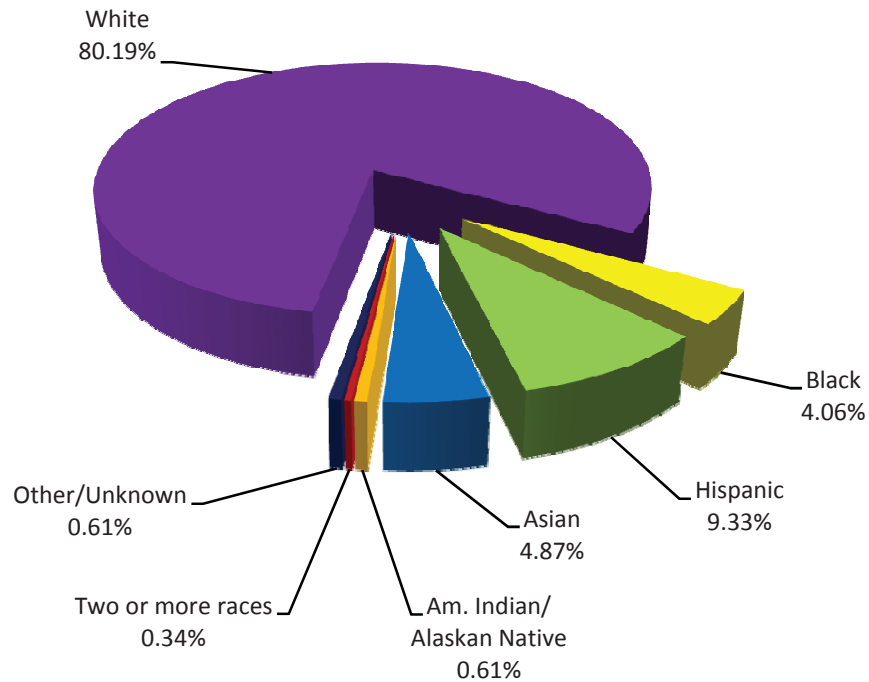

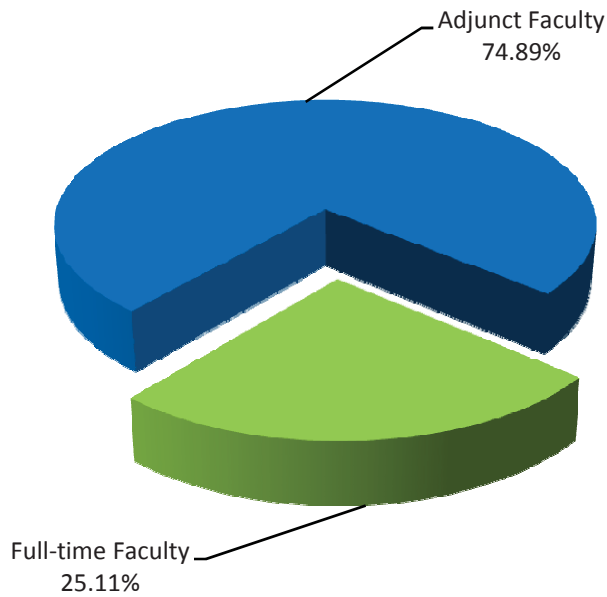
