<b>What improvements have been planned implemented</b>	We have completed a Pedestrian Lighting Project to address the issue of inadequate lighting for sidewalks that lead to remote parking areas for staff and students who participate in evening classes and activities. The project consisted of adding 21 lighting poles that are 12 feet high and evenly spaced along the sidewalk paths. Also included in the project was the clearing of brush that was within 20 feet of the sidewalks. This project has improved the safety of our students, staff and campus visitors.
<b>How did you decide that these improvements would benefit your unit or what weakness is the unit trying to improve</b>	The problem of inadequate lighting for the sidewalks was pointed out by staff and students who used the campus after dark so this safety project was initiated. Both Campus Police and the Facilities department had input into the initial assessment and the design of the project.
<b>Description of what measures are going to be used to determine if the improvements were successful</b>	Actual lighting levels at the sidewalks will be observed after completion of the project and compared to levels before work began. Feedback from staff and students will also be recorded.
<b>baseline data used to determine improvements were needed</b>	Complaints from staff and students along with observations of lighting levels before project initiation.
<b>target goal data that shows your improvements have achieved your goals</b>	Adequate lighting levels at sidewalk by observation and staff and student feedback.
<b>current data where you are currently in reaching your target</b>	The project is complete. Improved lighting levels have been ascertained by observations by Campus Police and Facilities departments. Feedback from staff and students have been positive with reports of "feeling safer" and "I am more likely to take evening courses".
<b>Narrative</b>	The Pedestrian Lighting Project was initiated to address the issue of inadequate lighting for sidewalks that lead to remote parking areas. This safety project has been completed and exceeds the desired results. We are committed to continual safety improvement on our campus. The next safety improvement initiative will be a campus wide effort to reduce the number of minor accidents and injuries on campus including slips and falls.
