What improvements have been planned/implemented:

Sidewalks that lead to remote parking areas do not have adequate lighting for staff and students who participate in evening classes and activities. We have completed the planning for a Pedestrian Lighting Project to address this issue. The project will consist of adding 21 lighting poles that will be 12 feet high. Also included in the project is the clearing of brush that is within 20 feet of the sidewalks. Construction on this project is scheduled to begin July 2012 and be substantially complete August 27, 2012. This project, which will add lighting and remove brush, will improve the safety of our students, staff and campus visitors.

2. How did you decide that these improvements would benefit your unit or what weakness is the unit trying to improve:

The problem of inadequate lighting for the sidewalks was pointed out by staff and students so I initiated this safety project. Campus police and the facilities department have had input and the planning phase is complete.

Actual lighting levels at the sidewalks will be observed after completion of the project and compared to levels before work began. Feedback from staff and students will also be recorded.

## Narrative:

The Pedestrian Lighting Project was initiated to address the issue that sidewalks that lead to remote parking areas do not have adequate lighting for staff and students who participate in evening classes and activities. Construction documents are complete and a construction contract has been awarded. The work is scheduled to begin July 2012 and be substantially complete August 27, 2012 before the fall classes begin.
