What improvements have been planned/implemented:

The College at the Round Rock Campus will be executing an extensive soil heaving repair construction project. The project will focus on stabilizing soils in and around building 3000 and 1000 by install systems that will drain ground and surface water away from the buildings.

Campus Manager's office will work with the Contractor, Campus community and Campus vendors to facility parking lot closures and safe and convenient egress to and from buildings.

How did you decide that these improvements would benefit your unit or what weakness is the unit trying to improve:

The project is both a safety and a beautification project. Because the nature of the soils are to shrink when it is dry and swell when it is wet, the utilities under the buildings are being effect as well as the flatwork around the building causing maintenance and landscaping issues.

Over a six month period numerous work order were filled to repair a rash of reoccurring minor problems. When maintenance did not eliminate the problems an onsite inspection of building crawl spaces prompted the College to contact outside vendors who could identify problems and provide long term solutions.
