How did you decide that these improvements would benefit your unit or what weakness is the unit trying to improve:

The Applied Technology and Public Services areas have a significant amount of high risk activities that require significant safety training for both faculty, staff and students to insure that a safe learning environment is available.

Each of the departments in the unit are using safety procedures as there SSI for assessment of attainment of proper safety aspects of their discipline. We will be using pre-post test exams and data from accident reports to assess the improvements in safety for all areas.

Applied Technology and Public Services has created a Safety Committee in conjunction with the Environmental Health and Safety Committee of ACC to meet each semester to evaluate and improve all common safety aspects of their areas.
