

## Intern's Observation of Mentor Reflection

Complete the Observation of Mentor Reflection immediately following the observation and submit to coordinator by October 22.

Many interns find that they develop many useful ideas while they observe another person teach in a similar content area. Interns should observe from a place in the room where the majority of the activity in the classroom can be seen in order to take notes and write reflections on the form.

Intern Reflection of Mentor: After the observation, interns should review their notes and reflect on what they saw and learned from the process of the observation. The mentor may help to facilitate the thinking process of the intern by asking questions such as "What have you discovered that would assist you in your teaching? As I taught this lesson, what did you see that could improve your teaching? What specific strategies did you see that you might use in your own classroom? What might be different in your classroom as compared to mine that would require you to adapt some of the things that I have done? What adaptations would you make?" The intern should feel free and open to discuss these with the mentor.
