The University of Houston-Victoria
For the 2006 – 2007 Academic Year**

The University of Houston-Victoria offers this 2+2 plan as a companion guide to Austin Community College (lower-division courses) catalog and the UH-Victoria (upper-division courses) catalog. This is a plan to guide you along the way to a four-year degree. We suggest you review the plan for your major of choice first with your counselor at Austin Community College. Then, schedule an appointment with the UHV degree plan counselor for your intended major.

The University of Houston-Victoria and Austin Community College have agreed to articulate the courses contained in these degree plans to enable students to transfer by the most efficient means. The articulation agreement is available in the Office of Admissions and Records at UHV and a copy is available at the end of this brochure. The program regulations listed in the agreement are summarized here:

- Students who interrupt their enrollment for more than 12 months will be governed by the catalog in effect at the time they return to ACC or UHV.
- A student may be covered under the same UHV catalog for up to 10 years from the date of the first enrollment at ACC.
- The student will be required to comply with curriculum changes made after the catalog year in which the student is first eligible, but no student will have an overall appreciable increase in total credit hours required for graduation.
- Students must apply to UHV and meet university and program admissions requirements.
- During the first semester at UHV, the student should finalize an official degree plan.
- UHV must approve any substantial changes in ACC course descriptions or course hours or have the option of selecting a replacement course.
- Students who change their major are subject to requirements in effect at the time the change is made.

Please note that we have listed courses in order for the student to complete prerequisites first. This listing is useful as a guide to give you an idea of what to register for in the preferred order. Keep in mind that some courses are offered only during specific semesters. To plan your program, please refer to course schedules from ACC and UHV and consult with your academic advisors.

You, the student, are responsible for all requirements of the catalog under which you are to be graduated. A degree plan counselor in the School of Arts and Sciences or the School of Business Administration will initiate your degree plan during your first semester of attendance at UHV.

TUITION REBATE FOR CERTAIN UNDERGRADUATES

Admission to University of Houston-Victoria

Undergraduate Admission Requirements:

You are eligible to enter UH-Victoria if you have already earned at least 54 semester hours in nonremedial college level course work from an accredited institution, have at least a 2.0 (A=4.0) grade point average and have passed all parts of the THEA (Texas Higher Education Assessment) exam, unless exempt.

A student who has successfully completed a minimum of 30 semester hours of course work at an accredited college or university may enroll at UH-Victoria if the student is concurrently enrolled in another college or university. Proof of concurrent enrollment will be required each semester until the student has completed 54 semester hours.

How to Apply for Undergraduate Admission:

To be considered for admission, the following credentials must be submitted to the UHV Office of Admissions and Records:

1. A completed UHV application for admission.
2. An official transcript from each college attended must be sent directly to the UHV Office of Admissions and Records from each institution. By requesting electronic transmission, you may shorten application processing time by two or three days.
3. THEA scores must be sent directly to UHV from National Evaluation Systems, Inc., or appear on an official transcript sent from each college that you formerly attended.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

UH-Victoria administers a wide range of scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study employment for students who qualify. Some of the scholarships are non-need based. It is to the student's advantage to complete an application for financial assistance as early as possible since limited funds require that priority be given the earliest applicants.

**Articulation Agreement
Between
Austin Community College
And
University of Houston – Victoria**

PURPOSE

In order to enhance the quality and accessibility of higher education, to ensure a smooth and successful transition process, and to strengthen the partnership between our institutions, Austin Community College (ACC) and the University of Houston-Victoria (UHV) hereby enter into a formal Articulation Agreement.

ACADEMIC PROVISIONS

1. ACC students who have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (on a scale of 4.0), who complete a minimum of 54 semester credit hours, and who meet all UHV admissions requirements will be admitted to UHV.
2. ACC students who have completed the attached transfer guides will receive credit for the courses identified in the transfer guide towards the following baccalaureate degrees at UHV.
 - Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences – General Business
 - Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences – Legal Assistance and Administration
 - Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences – Marketing
 - Bachelor of Applied Arts & Sciences – Psychology
 - Bachelor of Arts in Humanities – History
 - Bachelor of Arts in Psychology
 - Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice
 - Bachelor of Science in Psychology
 - Bachelor of Business Administration – General Business
 - Bachelor of Business Administration – Management
 - Bachelor of Business Administration – Marketing
3. Both institutions will strive to provide students with “seamless” access from ACC to UHV.
4. UHV will offer these programs online for the convenience of ACC students.
5. Students who interrupt their enrollment at ACC or UHV for more than twelve (12) months shall be governed by the catalog in effect at the time of the student’s reentrance to ACC or UHV.
6. Students may be covered under the same UHV catalog for up to ten (10) years from the date of first enrollment at ACC, or up to seven (7) years from the date of first enrollment at ACC for BBA students.
7. Students who change their major are subject to requirements in effect at the time that the change is made.

OTHER PROVISIONS

1. Representatives from both institutions will confer at least on an annual basis to evaluate the success of this agreement, to update the agreement and/or any attachments in regards to curriculum changes, and to consider any request for amendments.
2. Additional programmatic articulations will be developed as deemed necessary by both institutions.

RECRUITMENT

UHV will provide:

- Transfer support materials to ACC.
- Onsite recruitment and advising services.
- Information about ACC to students who do not meet UHV admission requirements or who need additional program prerequisites or requirements.
- Onsite training to advisors of ACC regarding the use of transfer literature.

ACC will provide:

- Opportunity for UHV representatives to meet with ACC students on an ongoing basis.
- Assistance in the distribution of updated degree and transfer materials to alumni and current students.
- Materials to UHV for distribution to students who do not meet UHV program prerequisites or requirements.
- Opportunities for a UHV online presence.

Additionally, UHV and ACC may implement other recruitment activities upon which they mutually agree.

SIGNATURES, AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION

This agreement becomes effective upon the signing of both parties and shall continue in effect until both parties agree in writing to modify or terminate the agreement. Termination of the agreement shall become effective ninety (90) days after written notice is given.

ADDENDUM

SCHOLARSHIPS:

UHV will provide one-time funding for the following recruitment initiatives in 2006. Funding beyond 2006 will depend upon the number of students transferring to UHV in 2006.

1. “Try UHV” Scholarships: The University of Houston – Victoria (UHV) is awarding an unprecedented number of “Try UHV” scholarships to new and prospective Austin Community College (ACC) students for the summer and fall of 2006. The “Try UHV” scholarships will offer students a chance to sample UHV academic programs and services by taking one course at no cost. Prospective students who have at least thirty (30) semester credit hours, and have not yet attended UHV may use their scholarship to pay for one junior/senior level course. Scholarships will be awarded on a *first come, first served* basis to students who: (1) have never taken a course at UHV **or** (2) are taking the first course toward a specific degree or certification plan at UHV. The “Try UHV” scholarship will pay the tuition and fees for one course. The student will only have to purchase the required textbook(s). The University of Houston – Victoria will provide funding for 100 scholarships for the summer 2006 and 100 scholarships for the fall of 2006.
2. ACC Staff/Faculty “Try UHV” Scholarships: ACC Staff/Faculty who (1) have never taken a course at UHV **or** (2) are taking the first course toward a specific degree or certification plan at UHV may use the “Try UHV” scholarship to pay for one junior/senior or graduate level course. Scholarships will be awarded on a *first come, first served* basis. The “Try UHV” scholarship will pay tuition and fees for one course. The student will only have to purchase the required textbook(s). The University of Houston – Victoria will provide funding for 25 scholarships for summer 2006 and 25 scholarships for fall 2006.
