



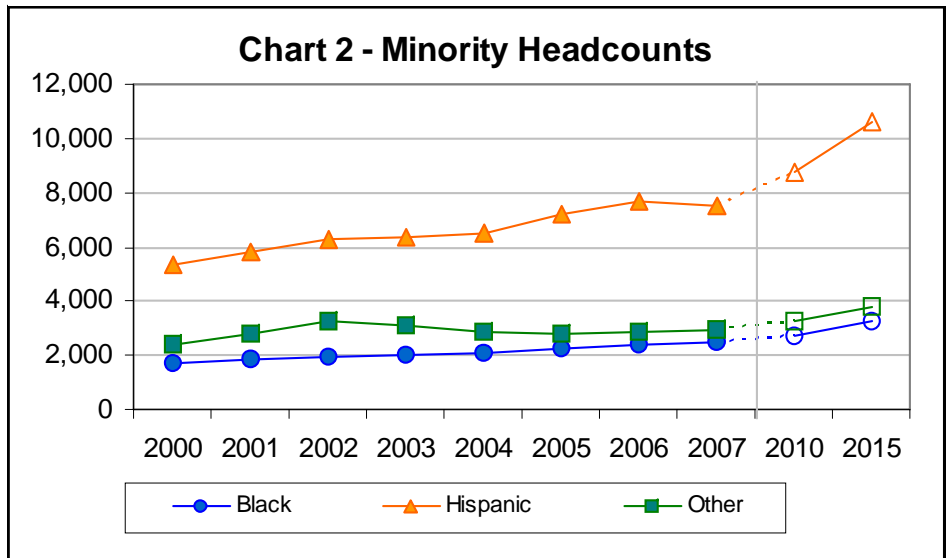
## How is ACC doing? (continued)

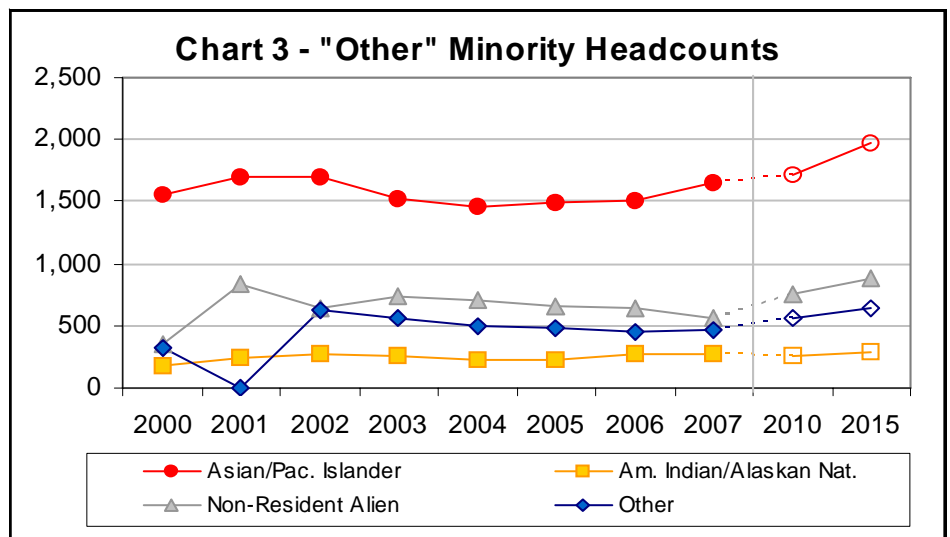
## Minority Headcounts

Headcount enrollments for Black and Hispanic students have had steady increases from Fall 2000 to Fall 2006 (Chart 2). In Fall 2007, Black student enrollment continued to increase (4%) but Hispanic student enrollments dipped by 3% from Fall 2006. Given the consistent upward trend since Fall 2000, this decrease in Hispanic student enrollment may represent a temporary "correction" or "noise" in the trend. ACC is fully committed to and continues to focus its efforts on recruitment and retention of all students, with particular attention to minority students.



Within the "Other" race/ethnic group, the big increase occurred among Asian/Pacific Islander students - a ten percent increase between Fall 2006 and Fall 2007. For both Black and Asian/Pacific Islander students, the headcounts in Fall 2007 represented the highest ever at ACC.

### Completions

ACC continues to be on target to meet its completions goals. In Academic Year 2007, ACC reached 38% of its projected 2020 target for all degrees and certificates. Although the number of completions has steadily increased from 2000 to 2006, Academic Year 2007 experienced a slight decrease for all students except for Hispanic students (Table 1).

In Academic Year 2007, ACC reached 73% of its 2020 target for Associate Degrees. ACC has focused its attention on increasing the number of Associates Degrees awarded and the trend for Associate Degrees is reflective of this effort. Examination of Associate Degrees awarded by race/ethnicity revealed that White students are currently at 92% of the 2020 targets. For Black and Hispanic students, the percentages are 47% and 59%, respectively. (Table 2)

In Academic Year 2007, there was a 24% drop in Technical degrees and certificates awarded. This decline is directly attributable to the decline in White students awarded Technical degrees and certificates in Academic Year 2006 (138 awards) and Academic Year 2007 (98 awards). (Table 3)

For the first time, ACC surpassed the 30% threshold for the 2020 targets in Health/Nursing degrees and certificates awarded. This increase, however, is due to increases for White and Hispanic students. Black students were awarded fifteen fewer Health/Nursing Degrees in Academic Year 2007 than the previous academic year.
