ACC and Very Large Texas Community Colleges - THECB Almanac 2014 Data

The Austin Community College District (ACC) is the primary gateway to higher education and training for residents in a 7,000-square-mile area in Central Texas. ACC is among the fastest-growing community colleges in the country, providing access to valuable programs and services that change lives and benefit communities.

This report summarizes key characteristics of ACC and its peer institutions as reported in The Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) 2014 Almanac.

General Enrollment Characteristics

- In fall 2013, ACC was the sixth largest community college among the ten very large community colleges in Texas (38,611 students enrolled in credit courses).
- ACC serves more part-time students (80%) than its peer institutions in Texas.
- ACC serves a larger percentage of students enrolled in technical programs (37%) than its peer institutions in Texas.

Successes

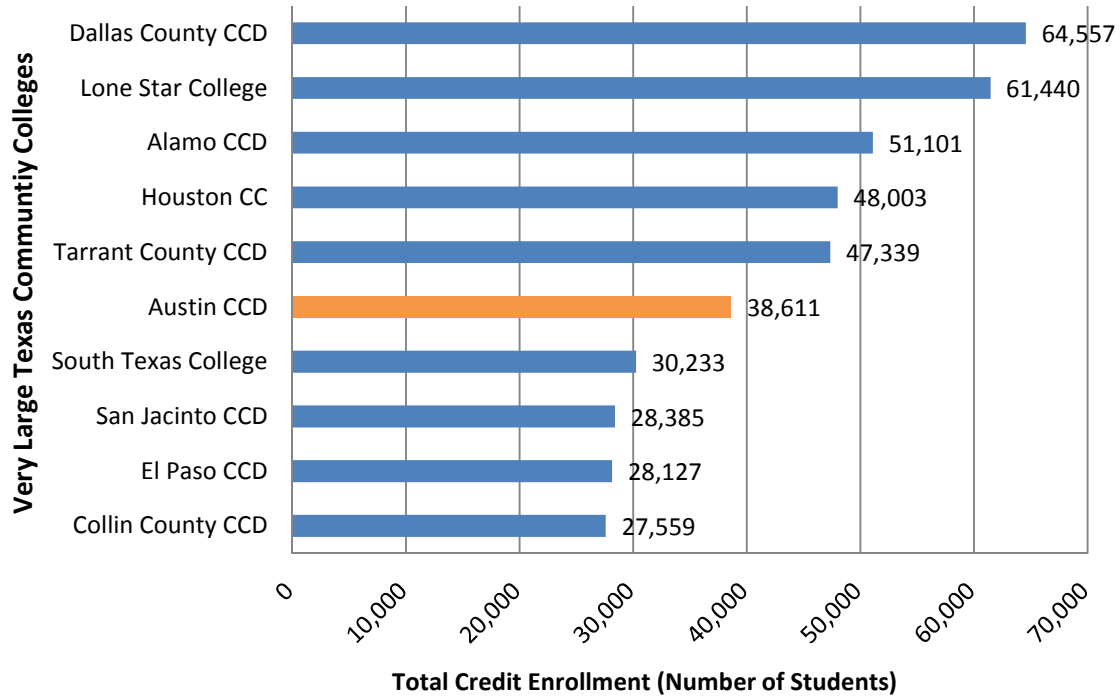
- ACC's six-year transfer rate for students enrolled in fall 2007 (29.8%) is the second highest among its peer institutions in Texas.
- ACC's six-year graduation rate for first time, credential seeking students enrolled part-time (25.3%) is the highest among its peer institutions in Texas.
- ACC has the third highest rate, among its peers, for first time in college students below *mathematics* standards meeting TSI (Texas Success Initiative) obligations within three years (21.0%).
- ACC has the fourth highest rate for students below *reading* standards successfully completing a college-level reading-related course within three years of enrollment (42.7%).
- ACC also has the third highest rate for students below *writing* standards successfully completing a college-level writing-related course within three years of enrollment (42.6%).

Challenges

- ACC ranks ninth among its peer institutions in total number of degrees and certificates awarded in 2012-13 (2,589 awards).
- ACC ranks tenth among its peer institutions in three-year and four-year graduation rates for first-time credential seeking students enrolled starting in Fall 2010. (3-year rate: 4.3% full-time, 2.3% part-time; 4-year rate: 10.1% full-time, 4.0% part-time).
- ACC ranks tenth among its peer institutions in average attempted credits to complete an associate degree for graduates in 2012-13 (101 semester credit hours [SCH]).
- ACC ranks tenth among its peer institutions in average time to complete an associate degree for graduates in 2012-13 (5.7 years).

Total Credit Enrollment - Fall 2013

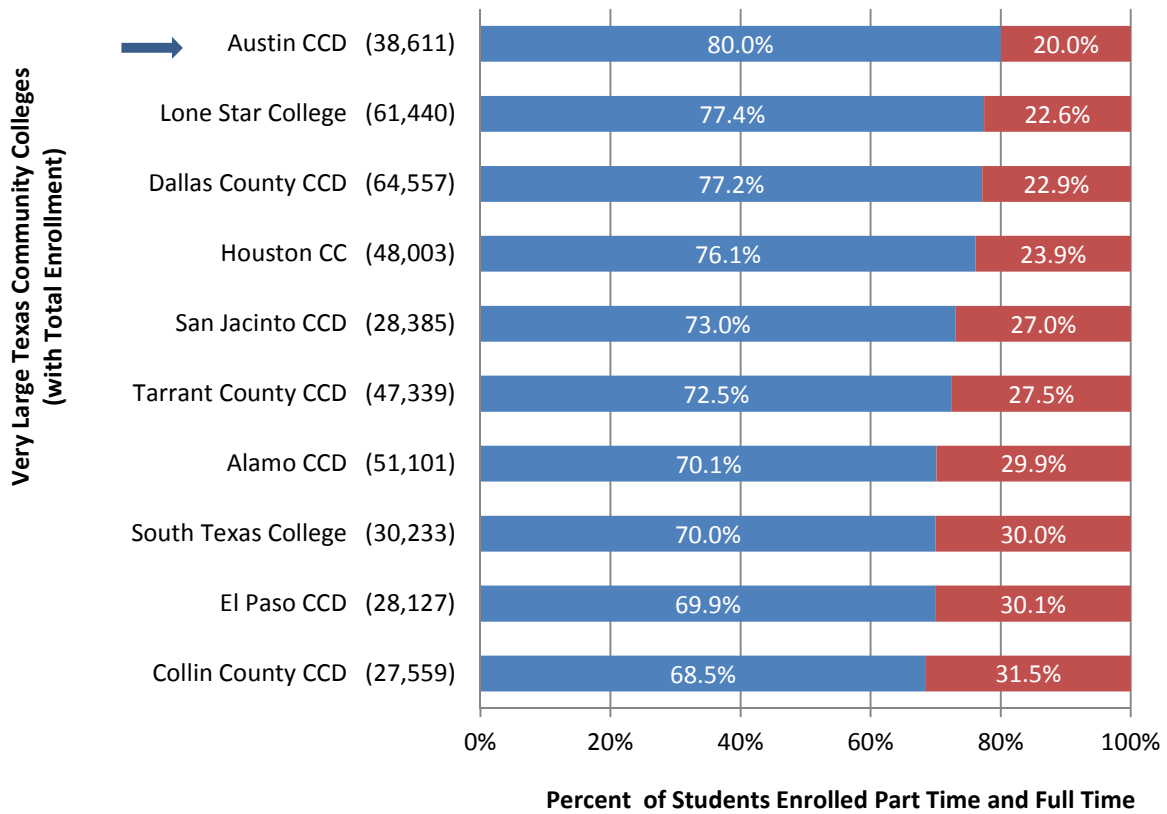

Enrollment by Part Time/ Full Time Status - Fall 2013

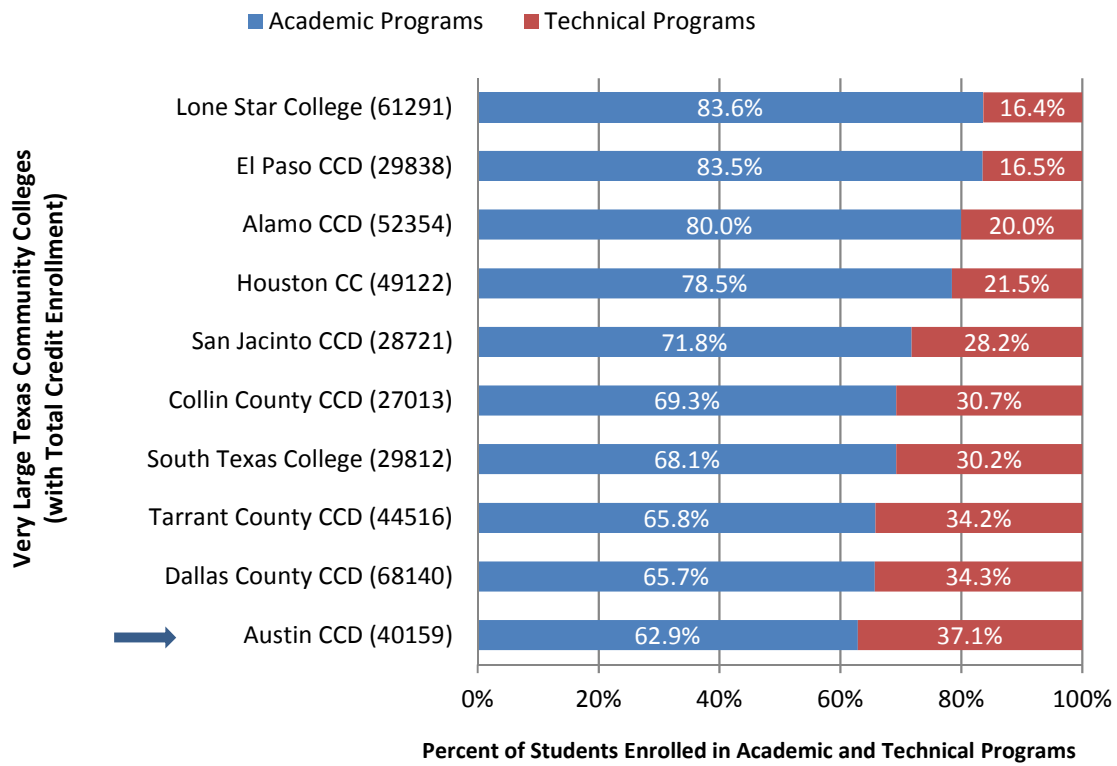

Students in Academic and Technical Programs - Fall 2013

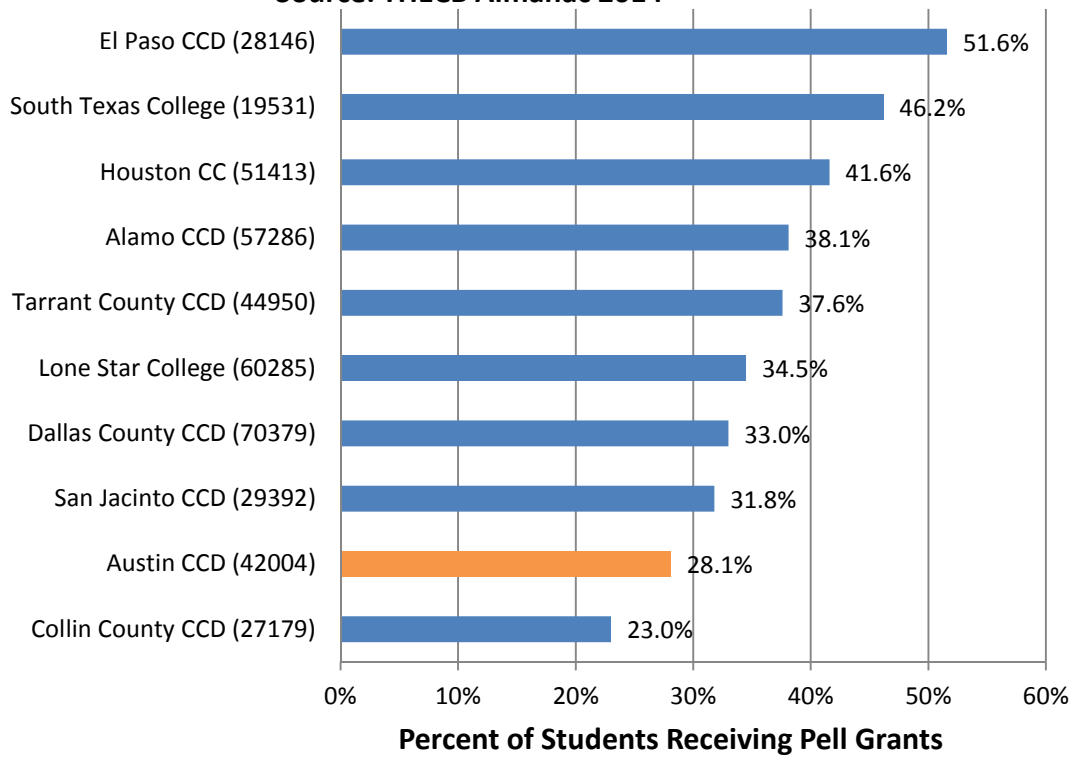

Students in Credit Courses Receiving Pell Grants - Fall 2011

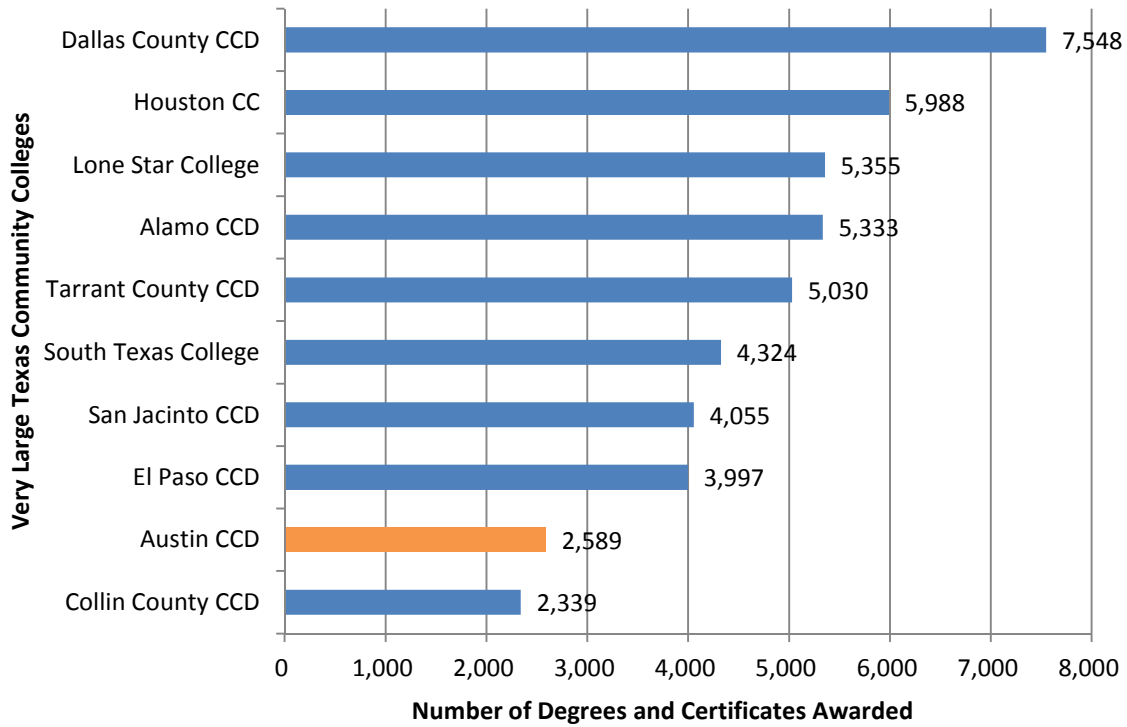

(with Total Credit Enrollment)



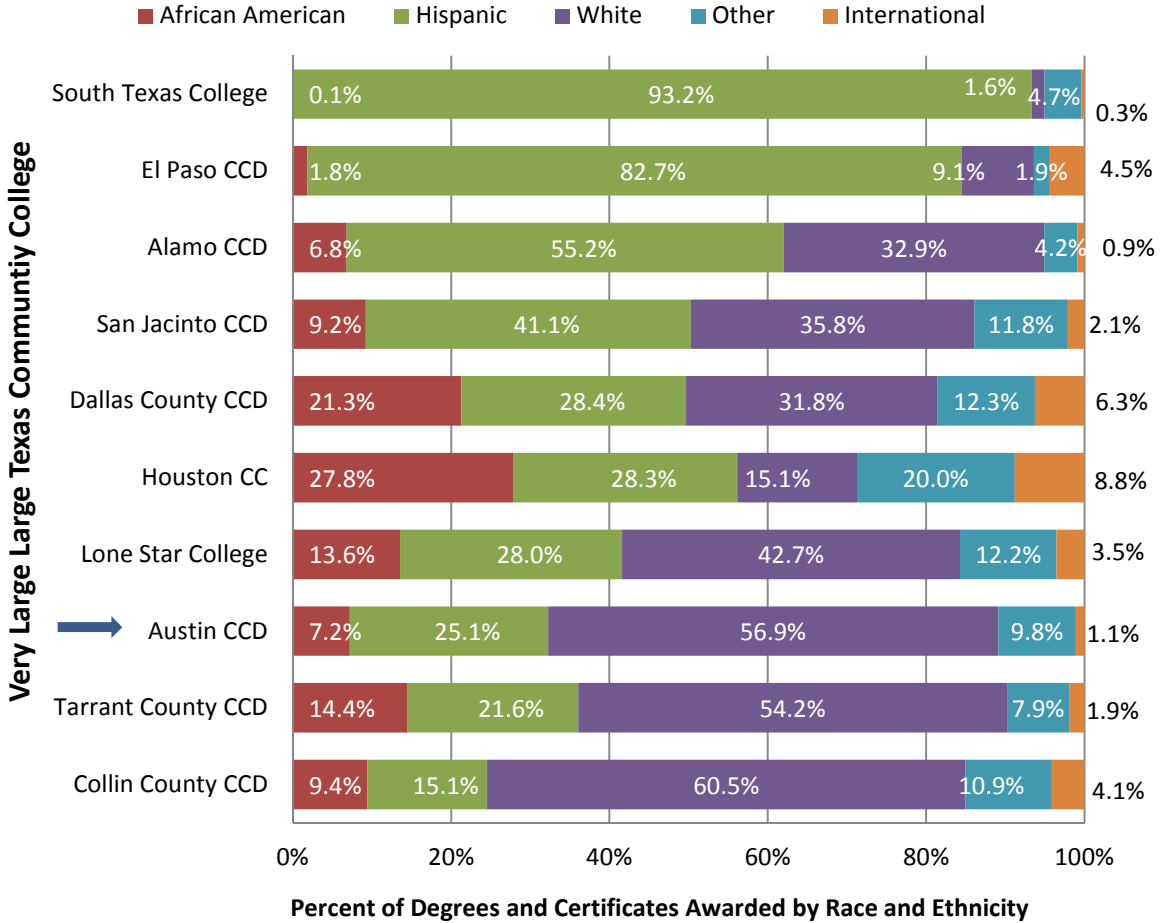
Degrees and Certificates Awarded 2012-13

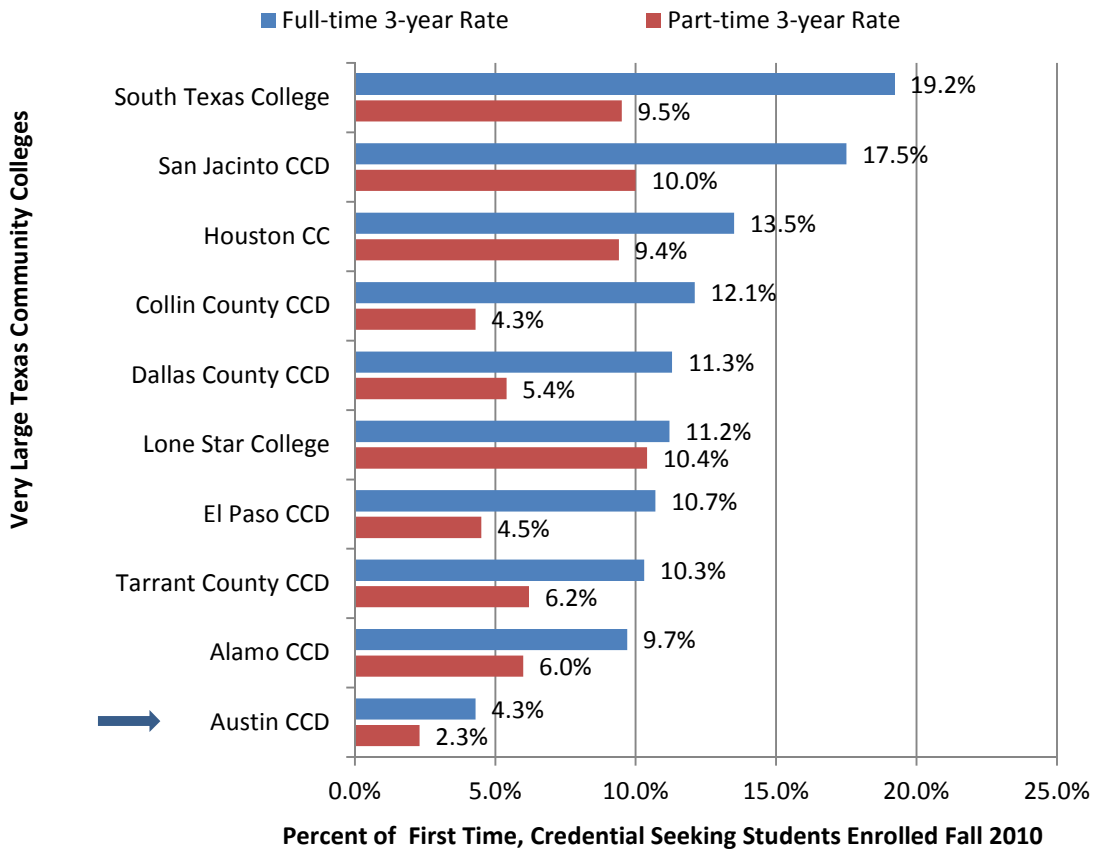
Degrees and Certificates Awarded 2012-13 by Race and Ethnicity

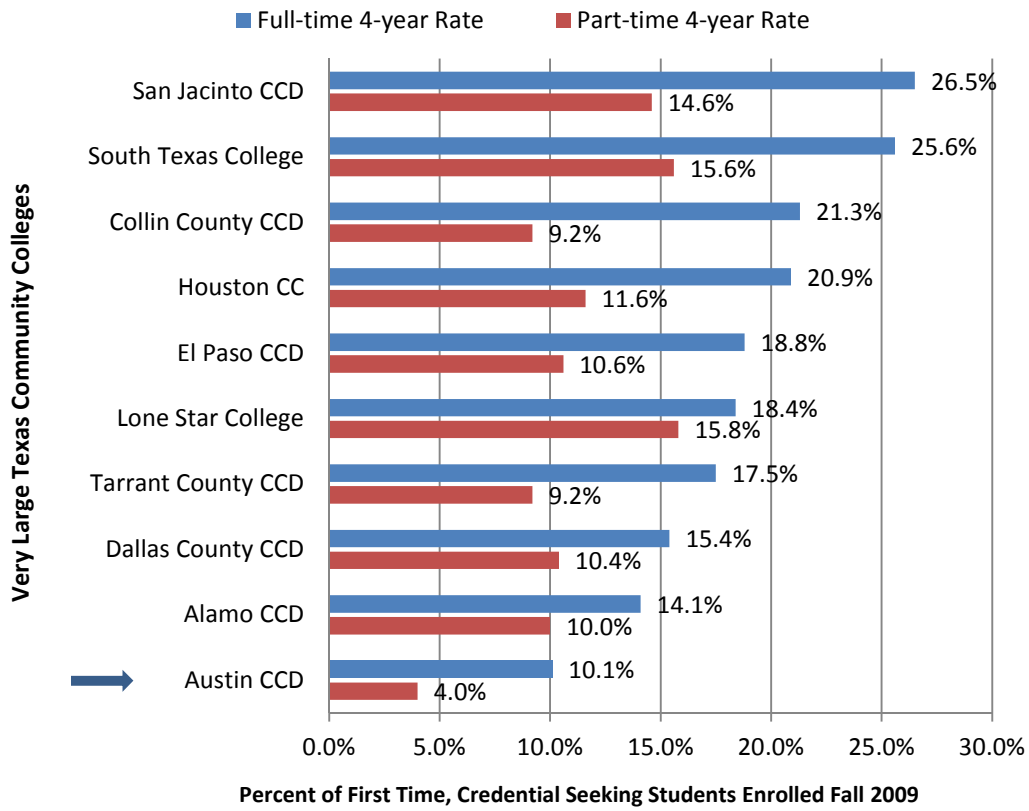
3-Year Graduation Rate through 2012-13

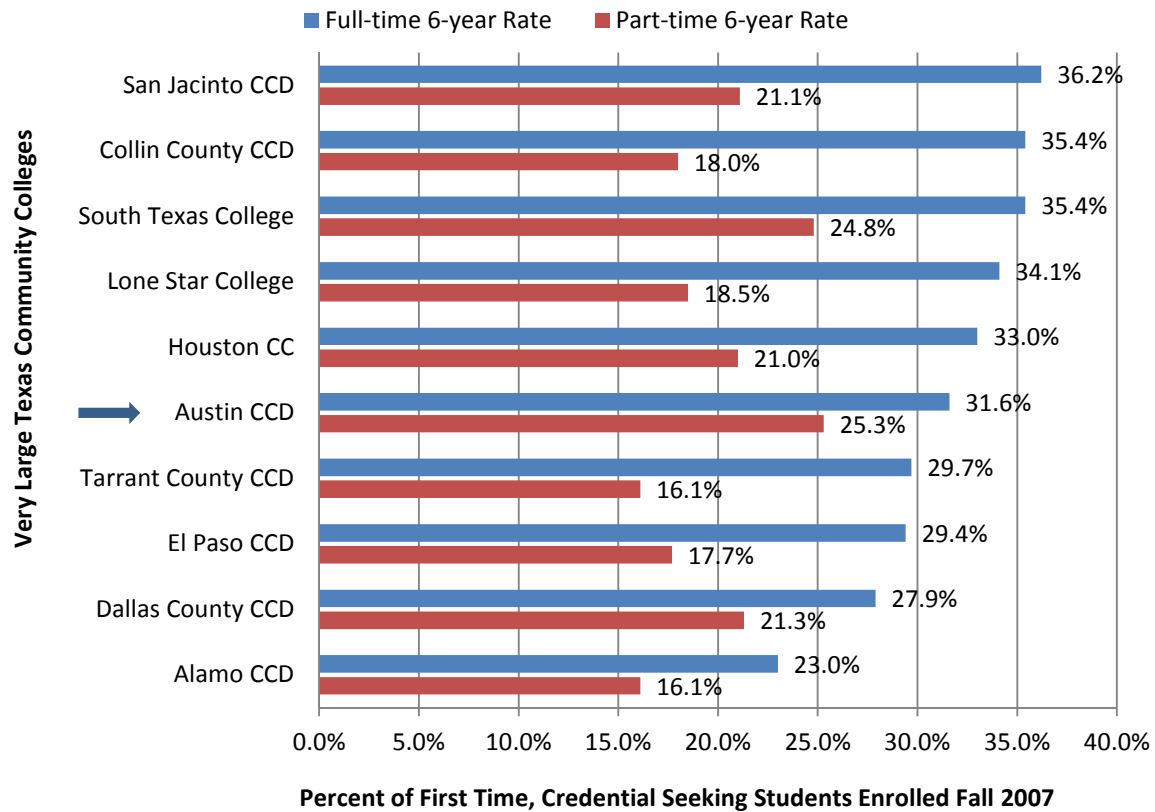
4-Year Graduation Rate through 2012-13

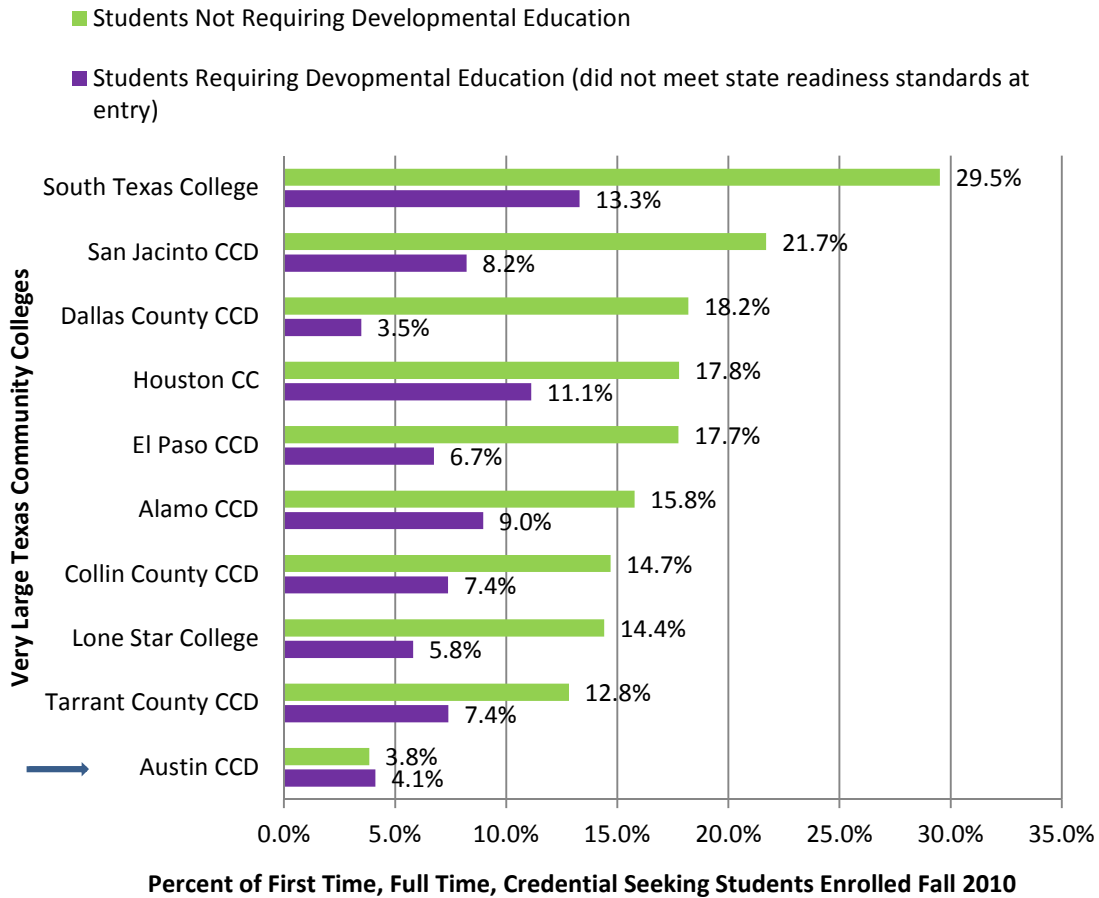
6-Year Graduation Rate through 2012-13

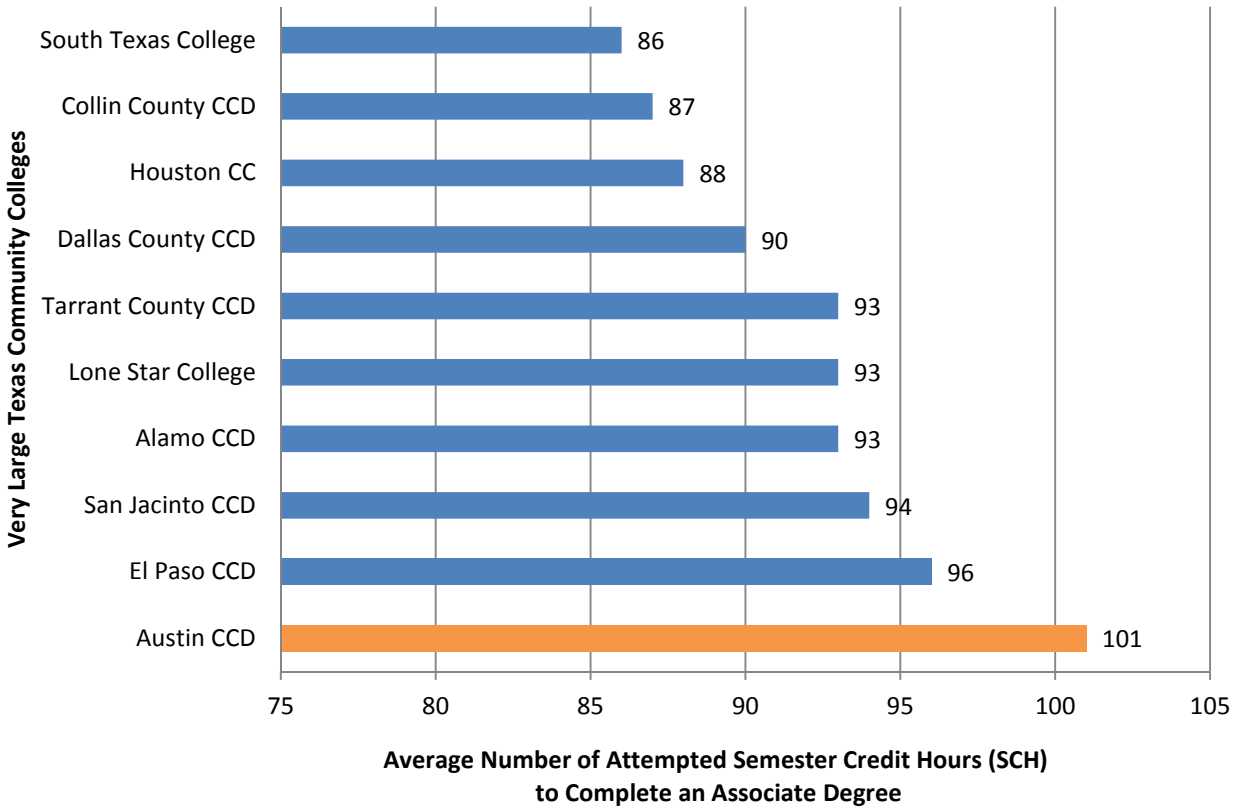
3-Year Graduation Rate 2012-13

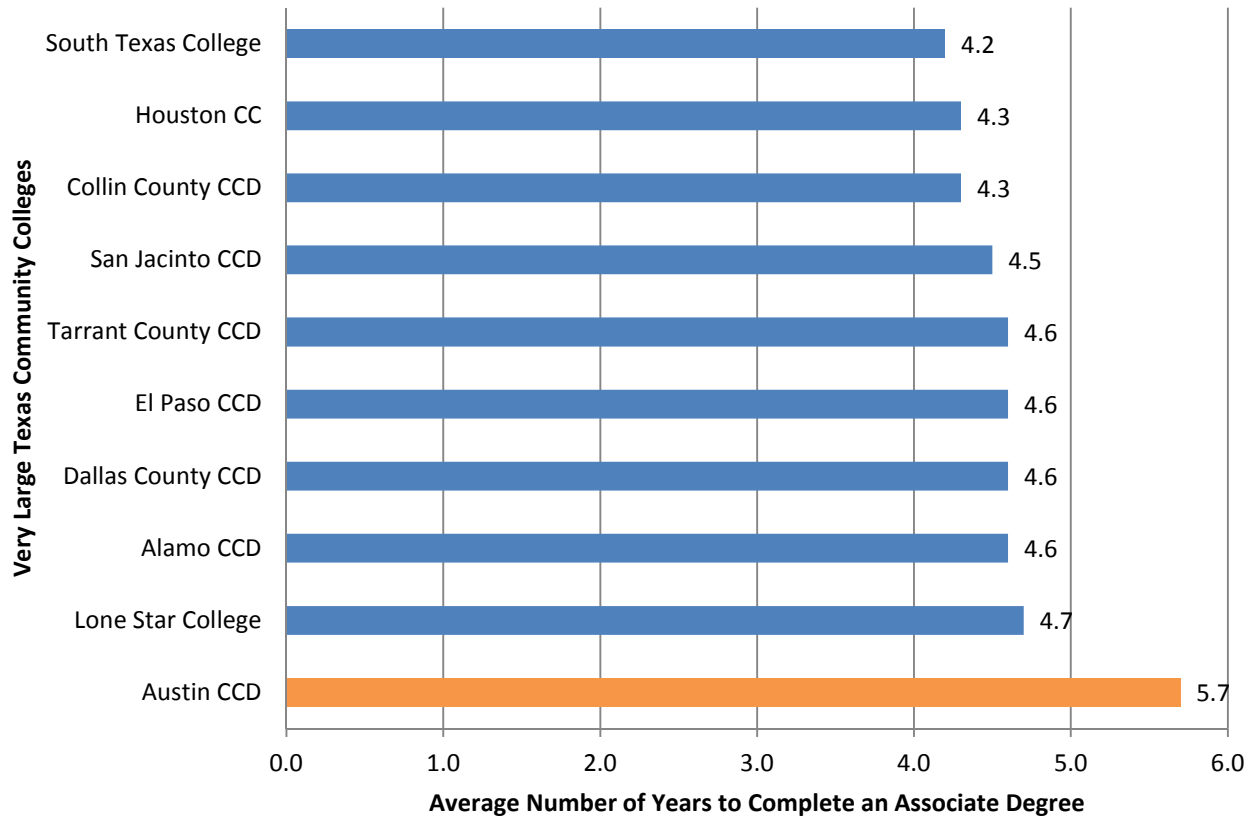
Average Attempted Credits to Associate Degree for Graduates 2012-13

Average Time to Associate Degree for Graduates 2012-13

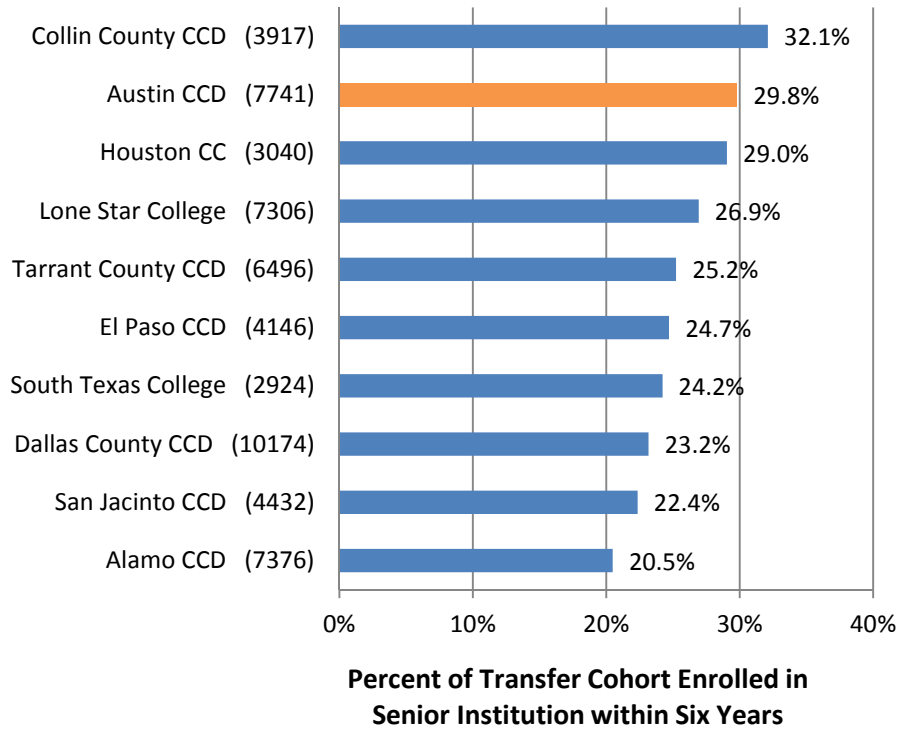

Students Transferring to a Senior Institution within Six Years - Fall 2007 through 2012-13

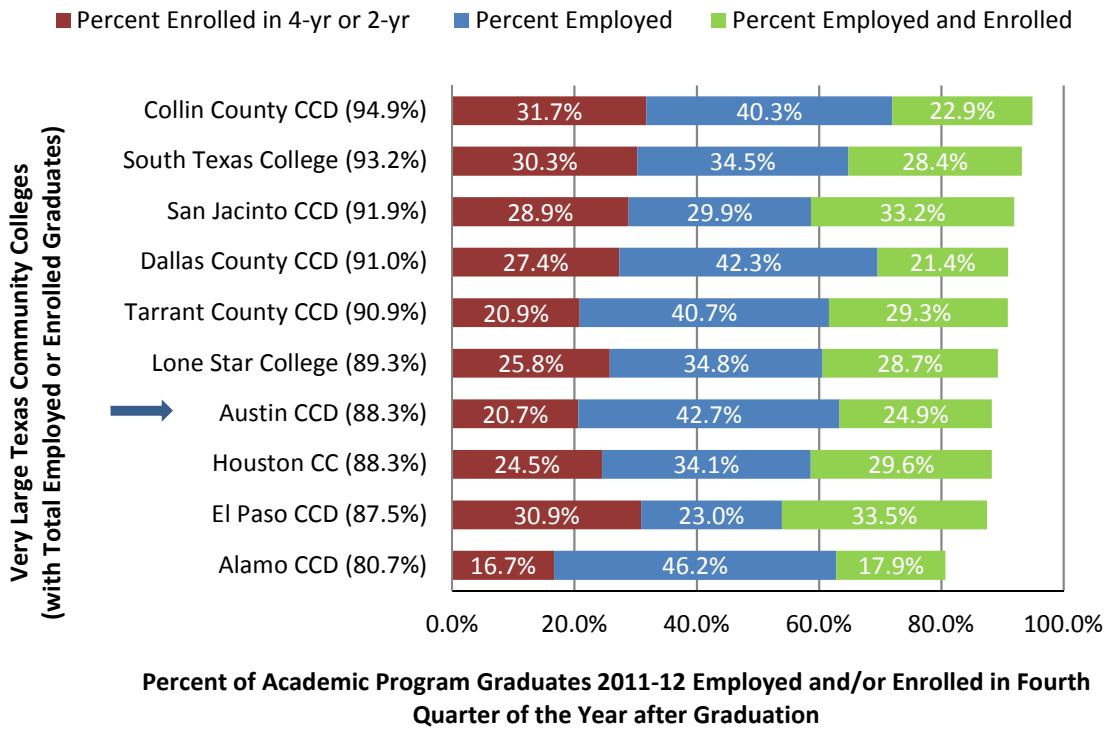

(with Transfer Cohort - Fall 2007)



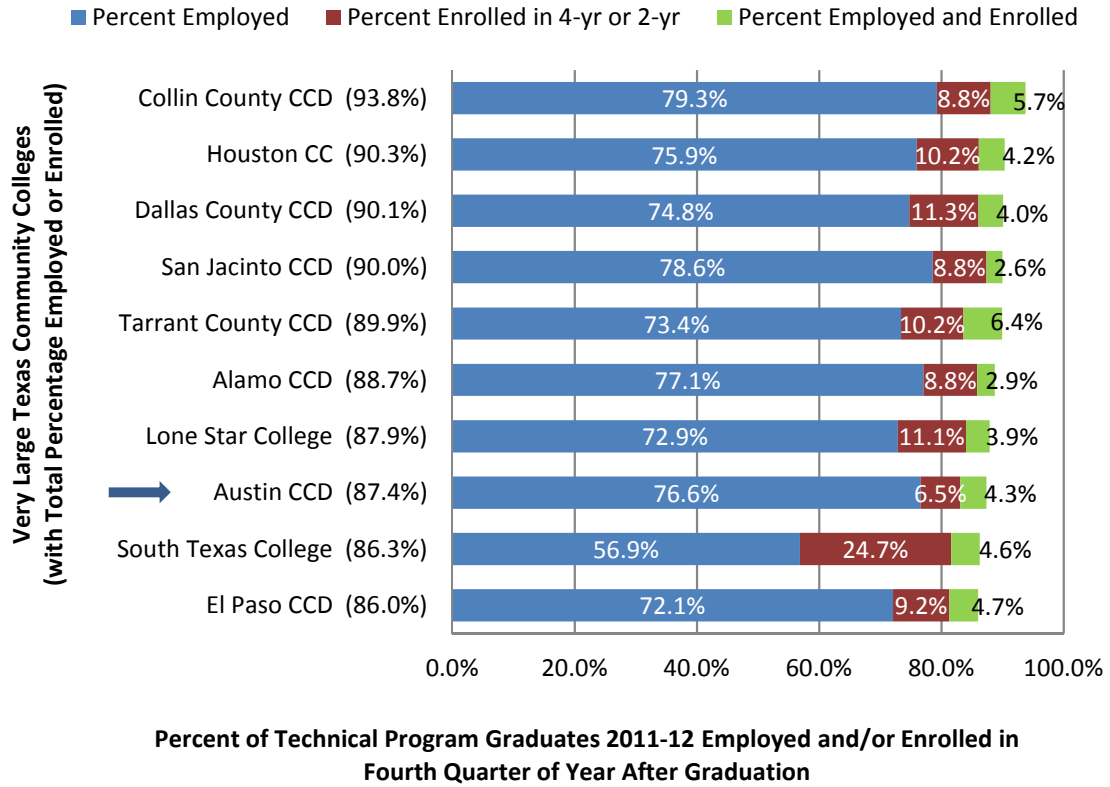
Success of Academic Program Graduates 2011-12

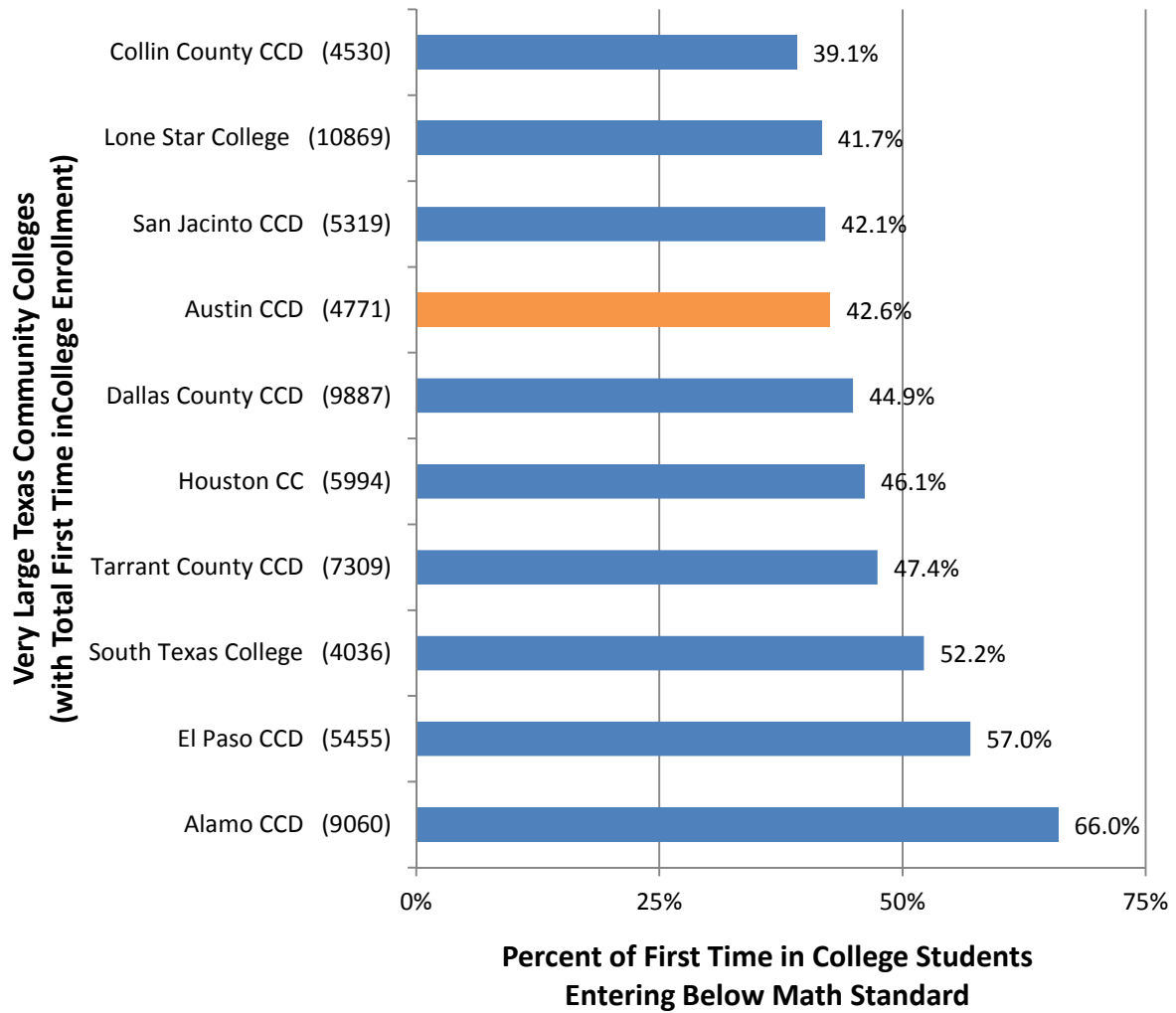
Success of Technical Program Graduates 2011-12

First Time in College Students Entering Below Math Standard - Fall 2009

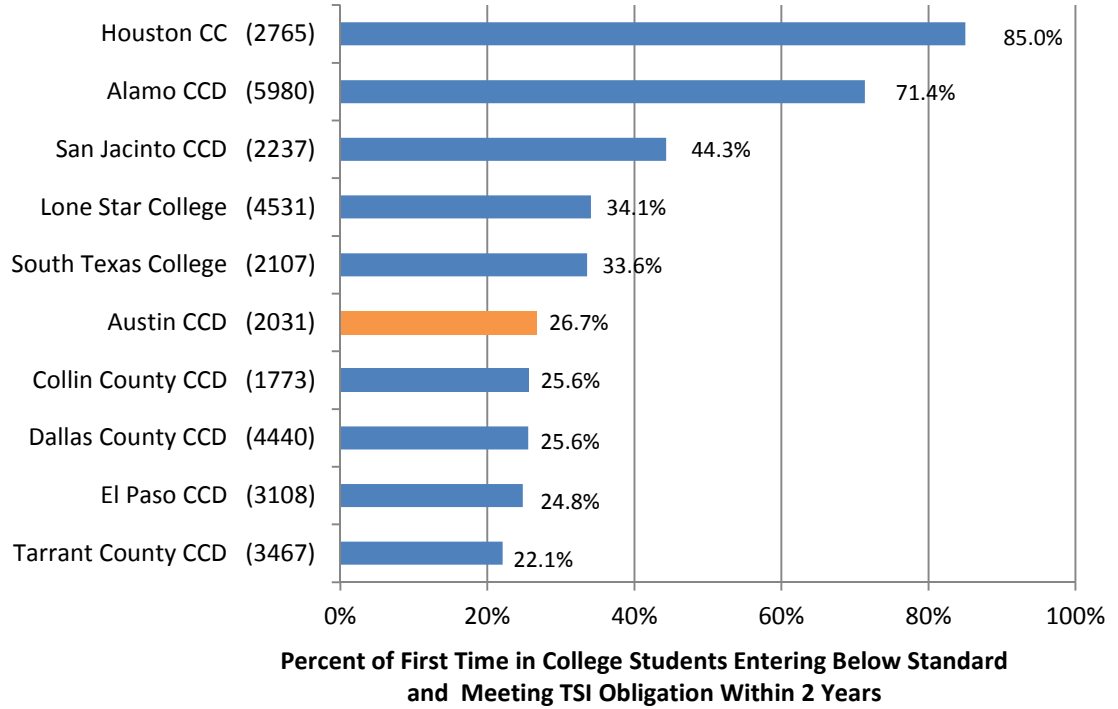

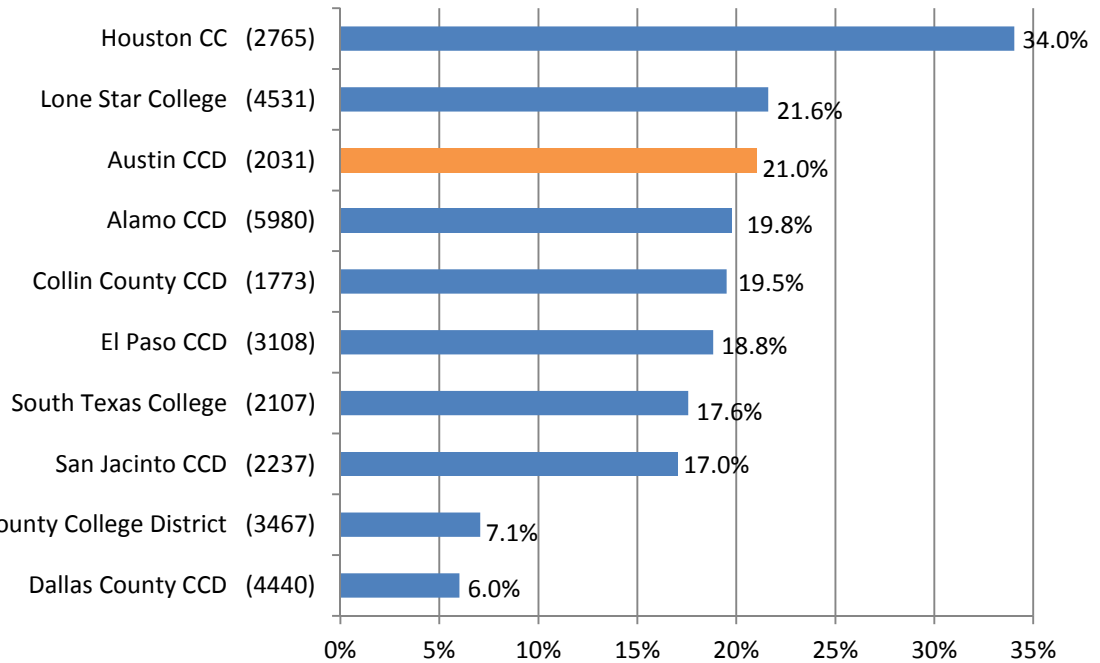

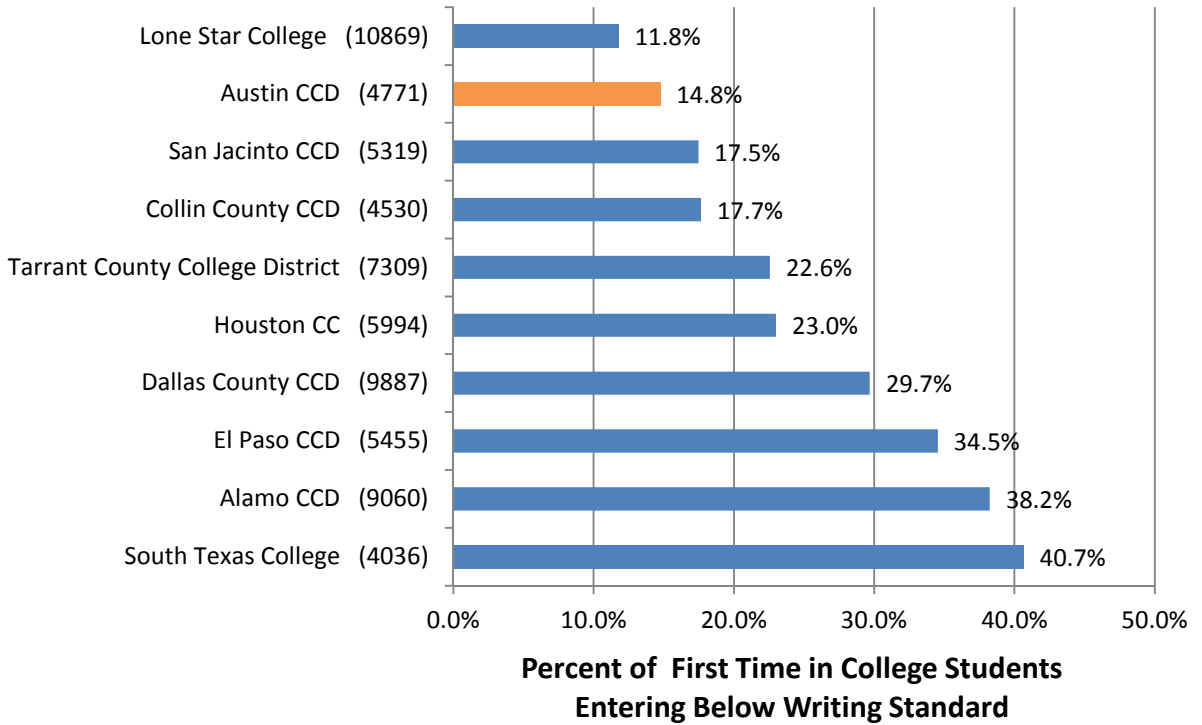


Percent of First Time in College Students Entering Below Standard and Completing College-Level Course in Related Area Within 3 Years

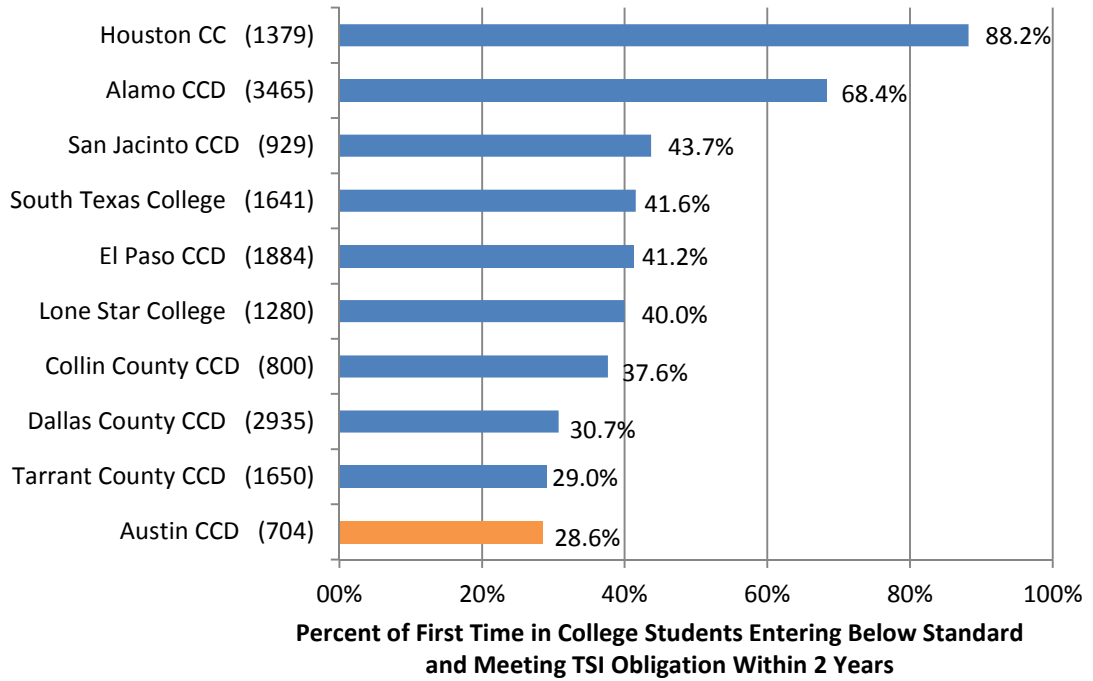

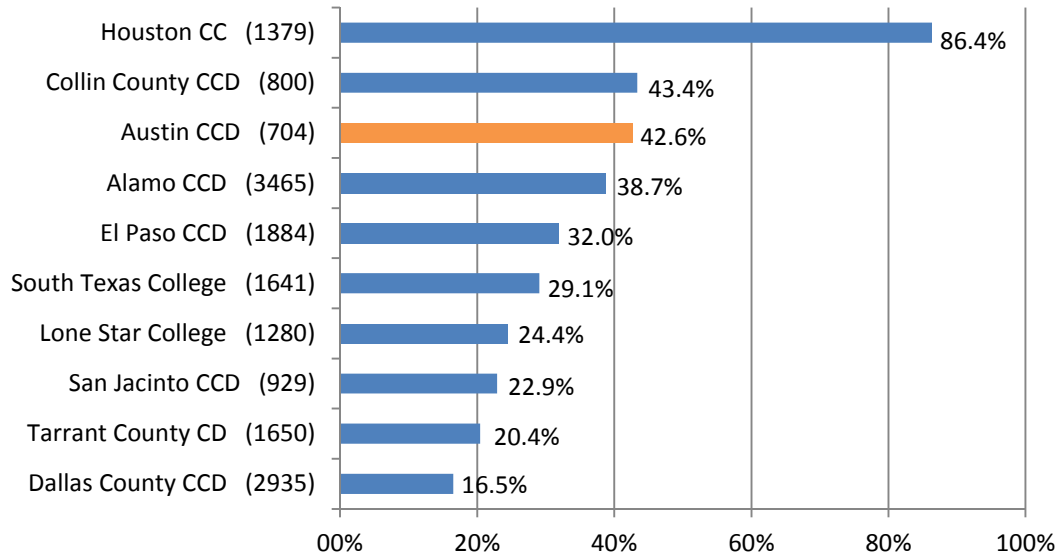

Students Below Standard Successfully Completing College-Level Writing-Related Course Within 3 Years of Fall 2009 Enrollment

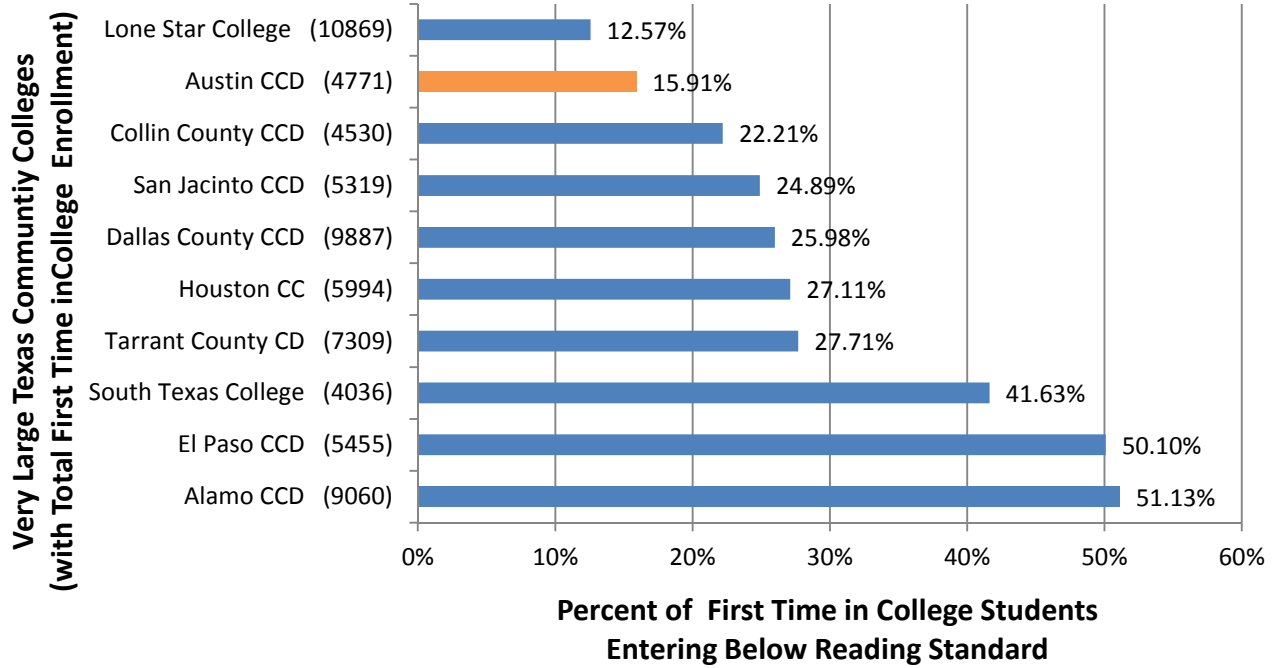

Percent of First Time in College Students Entering Below Standard and Completing College-Level Course in Related Area Within 3 Years

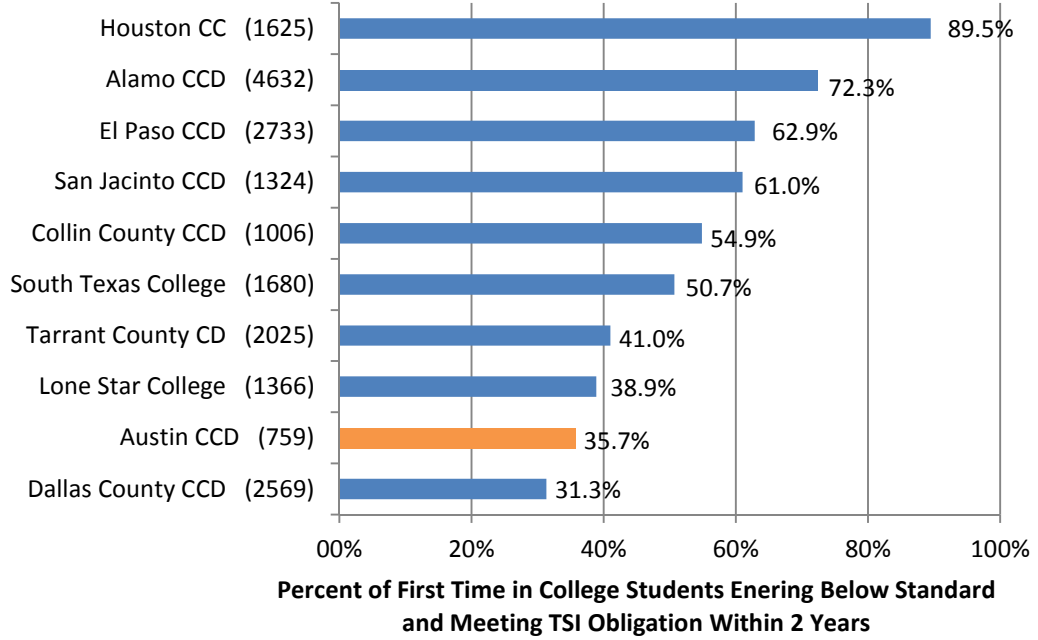

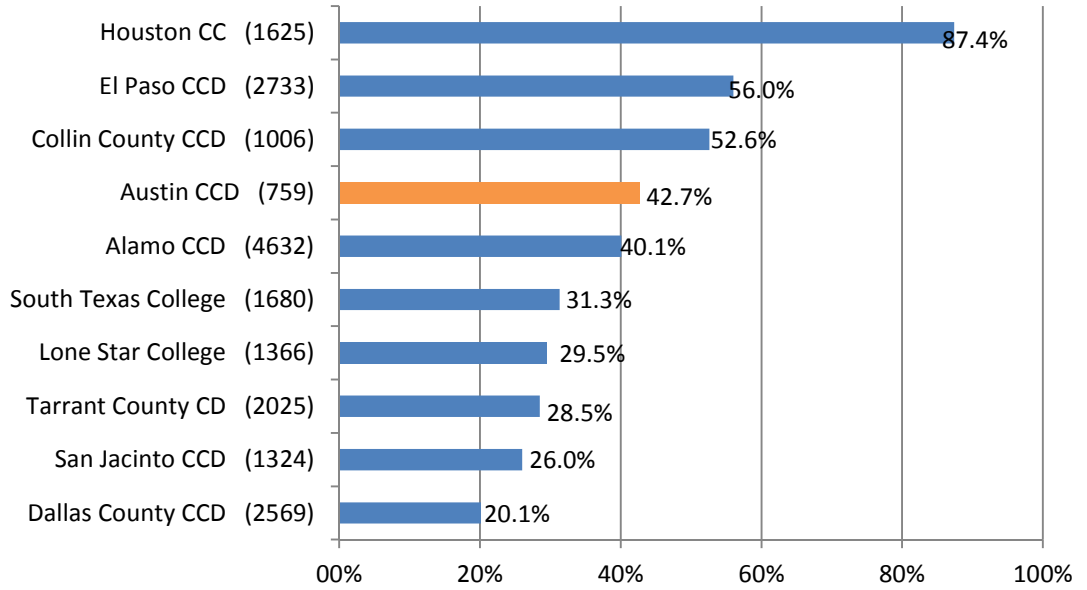


Students Below Standard Successfully Completing College-Level Reading-Related Course
