

Effectiveness Update

Student Services Effectiveness Measures Report for Academic Year 2004—05



PURPOSE

To provide exemplary programs that support the teaching/learning process and to increase opportunities for students to define and reach their educational and career goals.

INTENDED OUTCOME

1. The unduplicated headcount enrollment of ACC will reflect the diversity of the population the College serves.

CRITERION

Based on THECB demographic data (or U.S. Census data) for the service area, college-age population and the fall unduplicated headcount enrollment of ACC students, the percent of ACC students from each demographic group will be within ± 5 percent of their proportion in the service area college-age population.

RESULTS

Only White students were enrolled in proportion to the college-age, service area white population. Black and Hispanic students were under represented compared to service area population demographics, and Other* students were over represented.

INTENDED OUTCOME

2. The applicants who register and attend ACC will reflect the demographics of the applicant pool.

CRITERION

Based on demographic data from the yearly applicant pool and the annual headcount enrollment of first-time at ACC students, at least 75 percent of each demographic group represented in the applicant pool will actually enroll.

RESULTS

The percentage of applicants who actually enrolled hovered between forty and fifty percent for all ethnic groups except Black. Only 29 percent of Black applicants actually enrolled. The percentage of applicants who enrolled does not meet the criterion for this measure.

INTENDED OUTCOME

3. ACC will provide financial aid opportunities to students who demonstrate the most need.

CRITERION

Based on the Federal Pell Grant Program Student Payment Summary, 50 percent of students receiving Pell grants will have an Expected Family Contribution of zero.

RESULTS

This criterion was not met for the 2003-04 academic year. Slightly under fifty percent (47%) of students receiving Pell grants had an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$0. However, an additional three percent of students receiving Pell grants had an EFC of \$100 or less.

INTENDED OUTCOME

4. The College will maintain a loan default rate 5 percentage points below the maximum threshold required by law (25 percent).

CRITERION

Based on the Department of Education's Default Management Division's Annual Report to ACC, ACC's loan default rate will be at least 5 percent less than the federally defined maximum threshold of (25 percent) i.e., ACC's rate will be 20 percent or lower.

RESULTS

This criterion was met. The official cohort default rate for fiscal year 2002 was seven percent, eighteen percent below the criterion.
