Continuing Education programs at Austin Community College District are conducted in the following areas:

Business Assessment Center provides the Austin community with comprehensive coverage of professional testing services. BACT is aligned with numerous Testing Companies and educational institutions, both nationally and internationally, to administer educational, performance-based, and high stakes assessments for higher education, business, industry, and international agencies. The center has been recognized as a leader in the development and utilization of innovative techniques designed for management and security of the exams administered. BACT is the only GED Testing Center in a three-county area and adheres to the Testing standards of the National College Testing Association, Consortium of College Testing Centers..

Center for Teacher Certification provides training for those with a bachelor's degree and subject competency to become teachers in Texas. Candidates enter an internship as a first-year teacher and finish with a teaching certificate. Educator training is also available for professional development and additional certifications, training for instructional aides, online substitute teacher training, and childcare classes.

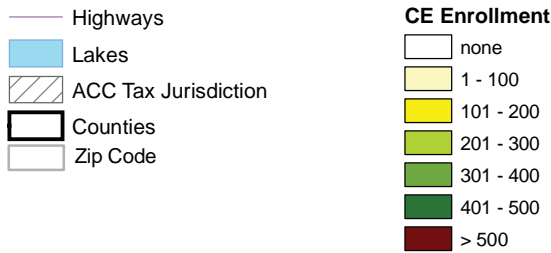
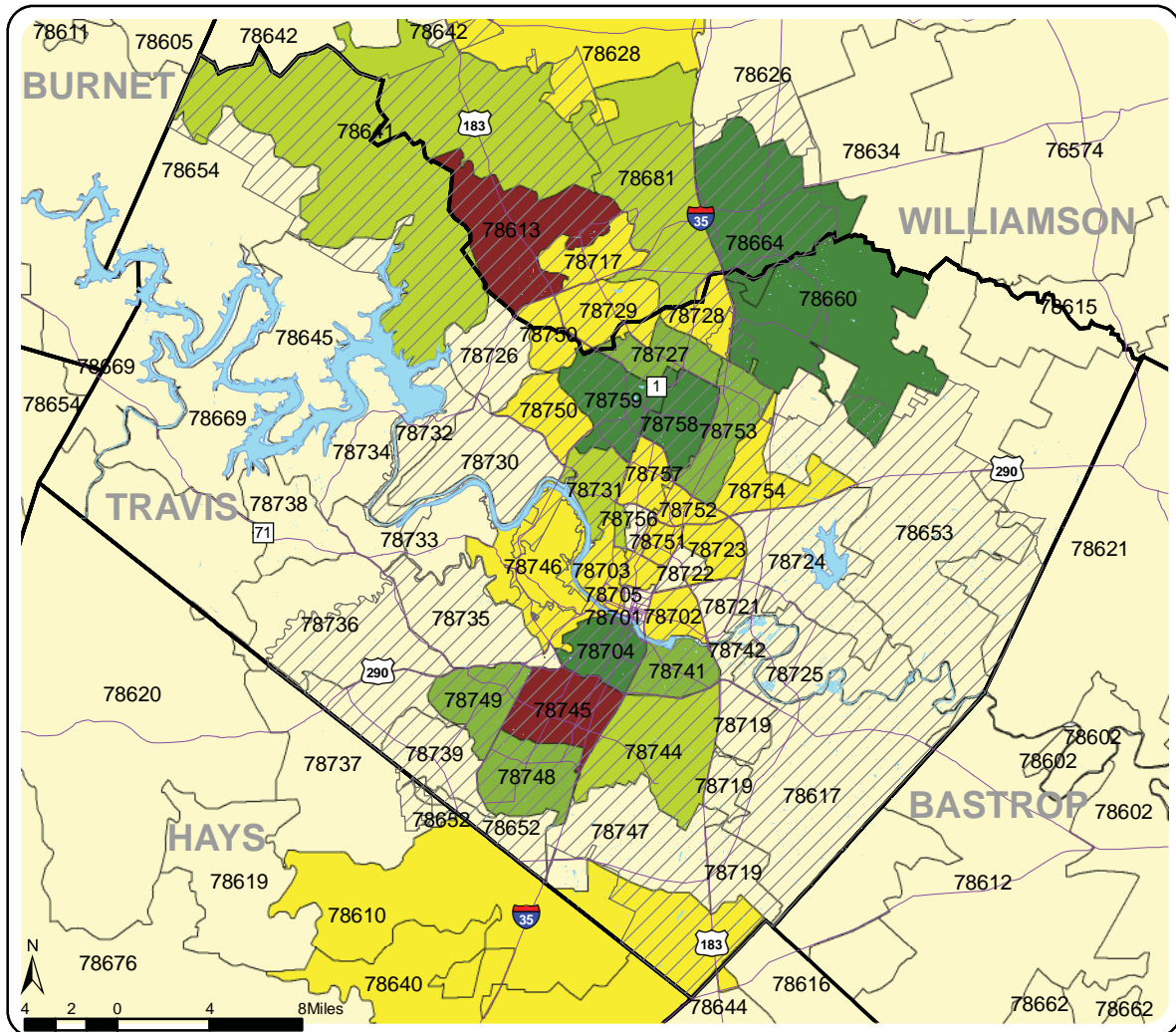
